TEN DROWN WHEN VESSEL FOUNDERS

Escape From Prov. Police May Have Cost Him His Life

West River Man Believed Drowned

Mysterious Disappearance Of Alex Cameron Of New Haven Who Attempted To Swim River To Escape Police Officers.

UNEMPLOYMENT FUND AVAILABLE SOON

Aim Will Be To Encourage Useful Construction That Will Be a Real Asset To The Municipality of Province.

OTTAWA, Sept. 23—Regulations to govern the grants for public works to alleviate the unemployment situation are being prepared by the Dominion Department of Labor and will be submitted to the Cabinet in a few days.

The bill, which Parliament passed providing \$20,000,000 to deal with the unemployment problem, was general in its provisions and the regulations will amplify these provisions.

No hard and fast rules will be laid as to the proportion of assistance the Dominion will extend in connection with public works which are initiated by municipalities or provinces.
