THE PARLIAMENT WAS PROROGUED

Very Small Attendance of Senators, Members or the General Public Witnessed the Event -- His Excellency Assented to One Hundred and Twenty-One Bills

OTTAWA, July 13.--(Special).--Parliament was prorogued at midday today by Earl Grey. There was a small attendance and very few persons saw the second session of the tenth Parliament close.

Not more than a couple of dozen members of the Commons responded to the summons of the Black Rod to attend at the Bar of the Senate. His Excellency gave assent to 121 Bills, and closed Parliament with a Speech in the usual form.

NAVY BULWARK BRITISH NATION

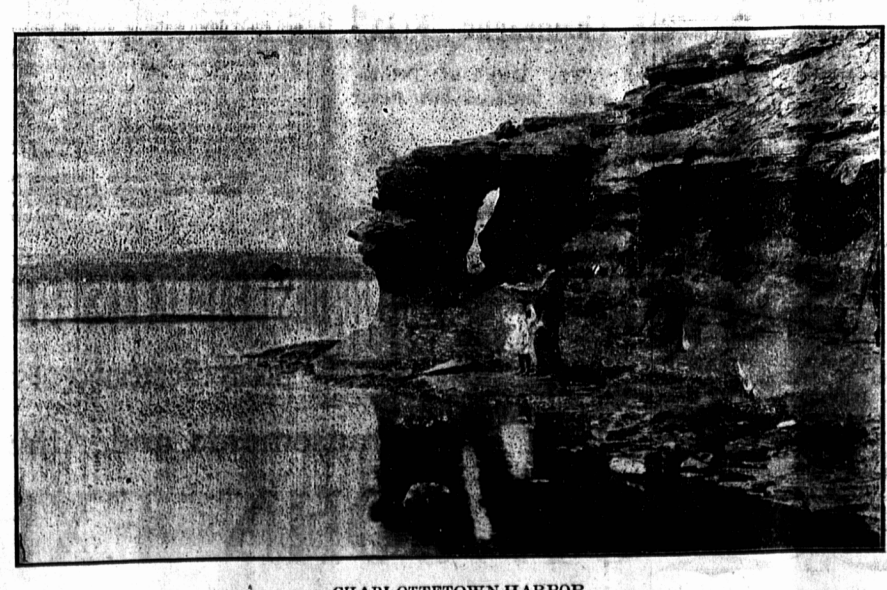
CANADIANS WIN KOLAPORE CUP
