The latest news, first of all.

There were no cases before the Police Court in this city yesterday.

A. S. McKay of Brace, McKay & Co Ltd, Summerside, was in the City yesterday.

The steamer Harland will leave here for Crapaud this afternoon at three o'clock.

The ad. re regular quarterly meeting of the Charlottetown Board of Trade appears in this issue.

Philip Howatt, of the Portland Packing Company leaves this morning for North Shore, N. B., where he takes charge of one of their lobster factories for the season.

A great many of the leading Methodist Churches in St. John and throughout New Brunswick referred last Sunday in fitting terms to the death of the late Rev. W. W. Lodge.

The outward cargo by the Northumberland this morning will consist of four cars mixed freight and also fifteen horses, which are being shipped to John A. Beck of Dartmouth, N. S.

It is understood that the Misses Stallo, who have been spending their summers at "Dalvay" for some years past, will travel in Europe for the next two years, and that "Dalvay" will be closed up until their return.

Rev. J. W. Atkins, secretary of the Moral and Social Reform of the Methodist Churches in New Brunswick and well known here, preached in St. John on Sunday last and strongly urged on the people the need for more funds for the work.

A correspondent writes the following from Rocky Point and vicinity:—The farmers are busily engaged hauling fertilizer for their farms. James Smith is busily engaged in digging a cellar, which he intends finishing in the near future. The school is progressing favorably under the management of the teacher, Miss Ida M. MacKenzie.

The Halifax Y. M. C. A. Basketball team which was at first scheduled to play in this city, against the Y. M. C. A. team here has written Mr. Archibald asking if the 19th and 20th April would suit as well as the 14 and 15th as at first arranged. The reply was made that the original dates would be better but if not suitable to the Halifax team those later proposed would suit. It now looks as if the teams will meet here on Tuesday and Wednesday of next week. It will be remembered that the Halifax boys defeated the Charlottetown Y. M. C. A. when on their recent tour by a score of 29-35. They are a particularly strong aggregation and two very close games are to be expected.

Householders in this city are awaiting with interest the probable increase in the price of ice in the coming summer season. It will be remembered that owing to unusual weather conditions the dealers in this cold commodity were not able to lay in just the stock they would like and those who secured the required quantity have not got ice of as good a quality as in previous years. The price will probably be increased by lessening the size of the blocks for delivery. Charlottetown is not the only city that will suffer in this regard. Owing to similar conditions dealers in Halifax, St. John, Montreal and other large cities have been forced into a combine by which the prices have been increased in the manner before mentioned by 50 per cent. in some cases.
