Galloping Golfer Tours 2,825 Clubs

SUBURBY, Ont., Oct. 13 — (CP) — Talking about hobbies here's one for you.

A 67-year-old pencil manufacturer from New York State, who finds golf a "mental cathartic," played on his 2,824th and 2,825th golf courses in the Nickel City recently.

Tanned and muscular, Ralph A. Kennedy of the Winged Foot Club, Manhattan, N. Y., in which he holds the No. 2 membership card, hopes to make it 3,000 before he retires.

He started his golfing career 39 years ago and has played in every state of the union, each of Canada's provinces and in nine foreign countries.

"It's just a hobby," he said at Suburby. "Some people like to fish. Others hunt. But I like to travel from one place to another and play on a different golf course each day. Sometimes I do several in one day. It's just around the country more than anything I know of."

The galloping golfer claims he has played on more courses than any other man in the world.

"I have my card, signed by the professional, from every course I have ever played."

He played his 1,000th course on his 50th birthday, his 2,000th on his 58th and his 2,800th on his 67th birthday this year.

WUSHROOMS MUSHROOM FOR EDMONTON FAIR

EDMONTON, Oct. 13 — (CP) — A lot of talk is heard these days about Edmonton's "mushroom" growth. That expression has a real meaning for two young Edmontonians.

Recently Peter Eliuk and Paul Laurak, whose business it is to grow mushrooms, harvested the whopping 7,000 pounds of the product—more than enough to supply the city's 137,000 persons.

Just two years ago the young partners decided to grow mushrooms commercially. Now operators of Edmonton's only mushroom industry they supervise operations at five large processing plants.

SEEK CANCER EXPERTS FOR INDIAN HOSPITAL

BOMBAY, Oct. 13 — (Reuters) — India's most modern cancer hospital is planning an advance research program and is in urgent need of experts.

Dr. V.H. Khanolkar, laboratory director for the Tata Memorial Cancer Hospital has suggested that the Indian government select medical graduates for advanced training in leading cancer institutions in the United States, United Kingdom and Sweden.

Of every 100,000 persons over 45, more than 150 die annually in India of cancer, Dr. Khanolkar said.
