Young Lad Defies the Law

MONTREAL, Sept. 26.—Armed with two 12 inch butcher knives a 15 year old lad this morning locked himself in the bathroom of his home and defied two city detectives who were obliged to break down the door and knock him unconscious to arrest him on a warrant for disobedience taken by the boys father an aged man who is heart broken at his inability to manage the lad.

The warrant was issued early today and detective Gagnon of the juvenile court was sent to make the arrest. The lad smelt a rat from an unknown place, he got the two knives and fled to the bathroom, barricaded himself and prepared for the last stand.

"Open the door" demanded the detective. Imprecations and threats to kill anyone who touched the door floated out of the bathroom. Finally the door was broken through. There stood the lad with flashing eyes flourishing the steel in each hand.

Gagnon who is one handed as present through injuries, slammed the boy on the jaw and he went down beside the bath tub. He got up, however, and detective Levesque, also of the juvenile court had to be summoned to complete the lad's submission and haul him before Judge Choquet. The case was remanded for further enquete.

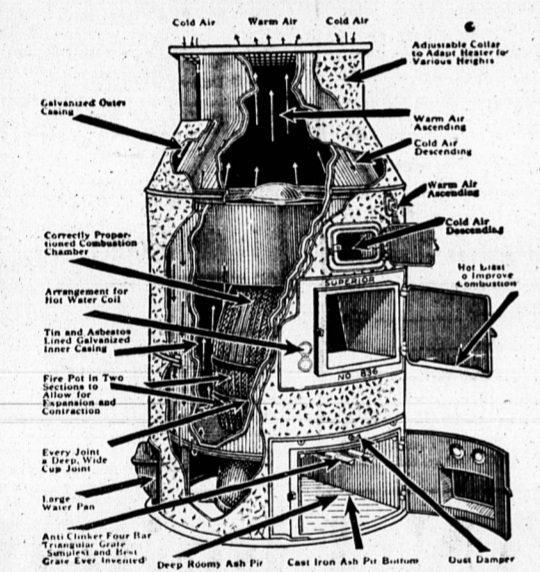

NEW JOBS FOR WOMEN IN GREAT BRITAIN LONDON, Sept 26—Recently a woman passed the examinations of the Surveyors' Institution and thus became the first qualified surveyor of her sex at all events, in Great Britain. Quantity surveyors are a separate branch with their own association. The fact that the work involves climbing about unfinished buildings has not deterred a girl from becoming a surveyor. Possibly, even probably, the future will see women jockeys. Women veterinary surgeons will soon be as common as women doctors. It is true that the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons does not, as yet, admit women students, but there are several veterinary colleges in the United Kingdom which open their gates to both sexes. During the war, the womenfolk carried on in the absence of racing trainers joined or called up, and some continue to do so though the actual license is held by husband, father or brother. Women engineers are now quite a strong body, with their own society and journal, while membership of the Auctioneers' Institute is no longer confined to men.
