recommendation "with the least possible delay." He also declared it will give immediate consideration to setting up an "authority" or "agency" to carry out the recommendations.

Mr. Chevrier said the board of engineers had reported unfavorably on proposals for constructing a causeway, a tunnel or a high-level bridge.

The board further reported, he said, "that the present ferry system was operating at a loss and its discontinuance would result in a substantial saving which would more than pay for the probable cost of maintaining and operating the proposed bridge."

Members of the board of engineers were D.S. Ellis, dean of the faculty of applied science at Queen's University, Kingston, and P.L. Pratley, another Montreal consulting engineer.

In addition to the revenue assets set forth in this paragraph there are the items of interest accrued on loans which are referred to in the foregoing paragraph 3, and there may be revenue assets of undetermined amounts arising from the following sources:

Report on the Finances of the Province

We have prepared and have forwarded under separate cover to the President of the Executive Council, a Statement of Revenue and Expenditures of the Government of the Province of Prince Edward Island for the year ended 31st, March 1948, together with our report thereon.

We would also state that it is our belief that the absence of information in the books from which to prepare a balance sheet is a major contributing factor to the unsatisfactory state of the records of repayable loans and advances referred to in paragraph 10, sub-paragraph (b) hereunder.

The instructions to us from the Executive Council of the Province requested us to ascertain certain liabilities and assets of the Province. It will be noted from the modified instructions that the liabilities and assets so ascertained are not the total liabilities and assets of the Province.

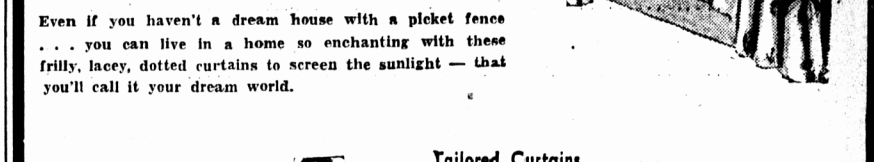

With the exception of the records relating to loans repayable to the Government such as loans made by the Fishermen's Loan Board, Seed Grain Loans, etc., we found that the books of account of the Government were well and neatly kept. The records relating to loans repayable to the Government are discussed at length in sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph. We also found that the majority of the books of account and other records are written up manually. In view of the great number of transactions undertaken by the Government, it is our opinion that the work of recording same, particularly in the Treasury Department and the Department of Public Works, could be more efficiently performed by the use of bookkeeping and other accounting machines, and we therefore recommend that mechanized accounting records be installed.

We have considered the possible advantages and disadvantages of one central accounting office for all departments and activities of the Government as compared with the present system of separate accounting staffs for each Department. The apparent advantage of a central accounting office would be a possible reduction in staff or a more efficient employment of staff through the maximum use of mechanized accounting equipment. A major disadvantage would be the removal of essential reference records from the Department and we realize that this would cause inconvenience to the Deputy Ministers and other officials and would tend to reduce the efficiency of the operations of the Departments. However, in addition to the foregoing reasons, we believe that there is considerable merit, from the point of view of supervision and detection of errors, under the present system whereby the Departments are independently responsible and are supervised by the Provincial Auditor. Our opinion therefore is that no change should be made at this time.
