## SUMMERSIDE BOARD OF TRADE ATTEND "GET TOGETHER" DINNER

Over fifty members of the Summerside Board of Trade attended the "Get together" dinner at the Queen Hotel, given by the President Mr. LeRoy Holman on Monday evening. There were also present the following guests of honor—Premier Arsenault and three soldiers who returned from overseas that evening, Sert. Norman McPhee Pte. Harold Gillis and Sapper Jack Peters. After a few remarks to the soldiers by Mr. Holman and three cheers Premier Arsenault extended a hearty welcome home to the soldiers and spoke of the bravery of the Canadians and the need of giving returned men every consideration. Dr. E. T. Tanton was next called upon and welcomed the heroes. After dinner interesting readings by Messrs. Geo. McCallum and W. N. Smith were loudly applauded. Mr. Holman in a short address referred to the advisability of starting new industries in the town as well as building up those that already exist. Mayor Morrison, chairman of the Marine Committee spoke on steamship service urging the re-establishment of ships to sail from Summerside. Mr. Lidstone of the Industrial Committee spoke on industries and although the committee has not got very far with their work the prospects of manufactures for the town are good.  
 Mr. G. W. Phillips of the Produce Committee spoke on farm produce and urged the erecting of a cold storage plant in Summerside.  
 Mr. Holman stated that Rev. P. C. Gauthier planned on being present but was unable to attend. It is understood from him that a movement is being made of establishing a creamery in each of the counties, the one for Prince to be in Summerside.  
 Mr. C. McArthur, of the Railway Committee spoke on the widening of the gauge of the P. E. I. R. and stated that the R. R. Wharf will be repaired and it is thought the "Northumberland" will again take up the service between Pt. du Chen and Summerside.  
 Mr. T. D. Ramsay, vice-President, spoke on the establishment of new industries.  
 Dr. Tanton spoke on good roads movement and discussed the matter of War Memorial Highways from Souris to Tignish and suggested that the best plan would be not to mix sentiment with business and to represent sentiment by a hall or club and business by building good roads. He

stated that his committee would be pleased to co-operate with Charlotte town on the matter of good roads.  
 Premier Arsenault in his address assured the the Board of Trade that steamers this season will call at Summerside on their way to and from Pictou, Newfoundland, Sydney and possibly Magdalen Islands. He stated that an Employment Bureau will be opened in Summerside if found necessary and outlined its objects. He also stated that the work of standardizing the railway on the Island will be hurried through. He spoke of good roads and stated that the government will do all possible in complying with their wishes. Other speakers of the evening were: R. H. McDonald, Secretary, John Campbell, B. G. Rogers, J. E. Dalton, A. S. McKay, Major Schurman and D. J. Bonnell.  
 A vote of thanks was then extended Premier Arsenault for his interesting address and Sheriff Wright moved that a vote of thanks be extended Mr. Holman for the evening's enjoyment and Mr. Major Schurman seconded the motion. "We'll Never Let the Old Town Fall" was then sung and three cheers for the hostess Mrs. Perry. The National Anthem was then sung, which brought the evening's entertainment to a close.—L.
