Concerning Dr. Heartz, son of Richard Heartz of this City, and Rev. Wm. Harrison, Cornwall, The Christian Guardian has the following:—Rev. Dr. Heartz, President of the Nova Scotia Conference, is not confining his activities to his own conference. Recently he gave a helpful day's work to the Wesley Memorial Church, Moncton. As a result it is expected that there will be a considerable increase in the missionary income. He also gave a fine address to the Men's League. His subject was three suitable C's, being Conscience, Character, and Christ. He also has a rousing article in the Wesleyan of the 18th on "Win One Aggressive Evangelist." It is a clarion call to his own Conference to work. Rev. Wm. Harrison, of Cornwall, keeps his hands open at work. During the last twenty years or more the quantity of literary work done by him must be prodigious. Article after article comes from his hand. And this form of activity is not at the expense of his circuit work. As a pastor and a preacher he has given his best to the people. Many persons in various walks of life have acknowledged the help that they have received from this production. About sixty articles have appeared in the Canadian Methodist Magazine, and the Methodist Quarterly Review alone. Besides, he has had articles in the Missionary Review of the World, Wesleyan Methodist Magazine (English), Ram's Horn, New York Christian at work, and numerous other publications. Still, his pen shows no signs of resting—it is as active as ever.

Regarding the Rev. J. A. Ramsay, lately inducted into the charge of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church at New Glasgow, N. S., the New Glasgow Enterprise says:—"He is a native of Hamilton, P.E. I., and received his education in the country schools then at Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown, Dalhousie University, Pine Hill College, and Edinburgh University. His college career was all throughout a brilliant one. In 1894, he graduated from Prince of Wales College with the highest degree diploma. A few years after he took a post graduate examination for an "A" certificate, and led the whole province in this severe test. In the autumn of the same year, he entered Dalhousie University, where he continued the same brilliant record, and led a number of classes in 1898 he obtained the degree of B. A. from Dalhousie, and in 1901, graduated from Pine Hill Theological College, having also qualified for the B. D. degree. In the Presbyterian College, he won the senator McKean prize for the best speaker from among all the contestants. The summer of 1901, he spent in most successful pastoral work in Sydney, where he succeeded in organizing a flourishing congregation. In the fall of 1901, he proceeded to Edinburgh, where he took a post graduate course in the university there, and where he attended the lectures of the great Hebrew student, the late Dr. Davidson, the celebrated Dr. Dodd, and the erudite Prof. Martin. All who know Mr. Ramsay speak of him as a man of most brilliant parts, of deep spirituality, great earnestness, and a platform speaker of the very front rank. St. Andrew's congregation is certainly to be congratulated on its great good fortune, and in the name of the community, we cordially welcome its young pastor to the growing town of New Glasgow, and we have reason to believe that his pastorate will be one of deep, earnest, lasting usefulness."

George Dixon, a negro pugilist, who at one time resided in this Province, of which many claim he was a native, the winner of several hundred fights, died recently in the alcoholic ward of Bellevue Hospital, a victim of a long fight with drink. Idolized in his prime by thousands as a ring hero, Dixon passed away practically penniless and friendless. He was 37 years old and for many years he had been a featherweight champion. He was familiarly known to prize fighters as "Little Blackie."
