THE WIRE WORKS OF MUNRO BROS

Work That This Progressive Firm is Doing

A New Invention that Promises to Revolutionize the Bed Industry—A Description of Their Goods.

Among the most progressive of rising young Canadian industrial establishments is that of the Munro Wire Works Ltd. This enterprising company from small beginnings, has arisen to its present flattering position by careful attention to what is wanted by the public and by the energy and foresight of its managing director, Mr. J. H. Munro, aided by an intelligent staff of energetic thinkers and workers.

The works are very conveniently situated for manufacturing and shipping purposes, having two railway sidings and a deep water front of 1000 feet. In addition they have acquired the John Bell field adjoining for future extensions. Besides a number of smaller buildings, they have four large buildings devoted to manufacturing purposes, viz. the wood working factory, the wire working factory, the mattress making department and warehouse and offices.

The wood working department contains the latest machinery for making and turning the wood required in their various lines.

In the mattress department they do the whole thing in the premises from the making of the excelsior on the premises right up to the finished product, and all is done by machinery; thus in everything they are on the ground floor and able to compete and meet the present competition.

There is no bed factory in either Canada or the United States that is better equipped for the work than is the Munro Wire Works Company. Their capacity is 500 beds a day. In their spring department they make and turn out all kinds of springs automatically. They even have machines that run the wire off coils, straighten it and corrugate it for window guards. Machines for making door mats, etc., are also in operation. In their fencing department they are well equipped and turn out both plain and ornamental iron, picket wire, lock wire and steel fencing.

For the general purposes of farmers, they after years of experience in making fencing, have perfected a grade of fencing which they call "The Hercules" and which they claim is the most durable, cheapest and best fence made. One advantage is that on account of having fine upright stays to support the wires, the posts can be set 16 feet apart and in putting it up no expensive tools are required.

In an ornamental fence we saw one the firm were just completing for Mr. Wilkie, Antigonish. It was a most artistic and beautiful one, and shows the kind of work the firm turns out in this line.

Another very comfortable article that elicits commendation wherever seen, is a Turkish couch, which is the acme of comfort and luxurious ease.

The firm also make a specialty of beds and cots for hospitals and institutions. Their new offices are large, commodious and equipped with every facility for the work.

The Munro Wire Works Co. are putting on the market this year a new spring bed with new patent all steel frame. There is no wood about the bed at all. All is steel and wire. They control the patent for Canada. These beds are being manufactured out of a heavy wire formed into V's. To make a bed 500 of these V's are looped into each other by hand necessitating the hammering down of about one thousand raw ends of wire. This was a tedious and expensive process. To overcome this Mr. James Munro has been experimenting for the last four years and we are pleased to say that his experiments have now achieved a most wonderful triumph along mechanical lines, for he has not alone designed a new form of fabric that eclipses the old in every way, but he has, with the assistance of skilled machine builders, produced a power automatic wire framing machine that takes the wire direct off the coil and by the most ingenious of mechanical movements forms it into continuous V's of wire with automatic snaphooks which permits these rows of V shaped wires to snap into the plain companion rows of wire thus forming a spring bed that has the most perfect resiliency and without any sagging.

Several of these new spring beds have been submitted to expert bed men and leading merchants and their announcement is, that it combines all the merits of the best spring beds and none of their faults.

Gigantic Stone.
The largest stone ever known to have been cut in the history of the world was taken from the famous old quarry of Craigleith, Edinburgh. It was excavated in November, 1823, at the time of the National Monument on the Calton Hill was in course of erection. It was 136 feet in length and its size was equal to the depth of the quarry at that time. It averaged 20 feet in breadth, while its weight was reputed to be 15,000 tons. The stone was longitudinal cut from a stratum of very fine lime rock. The greater portion of this giant rock went toward the erection of the monument on Calton Hill. George IV. heard about this stone, and requested that part of it should be sent to Buckingham Palace for use in connection with some extensions being then carried out there. This was forwarded by boat from Granton. The twelve finished columns of the National Monument were all built of Craigleith stones, each block weighing from 10 to 15 tons. If one goes back to the old world many gigantic stones are found. For instance, in the Temple of the Sun at Baalbec there are stones 60 feet long, 24 feet thick, and 16 broad, each embracing 23,000 cubic feet.

"Light of the World."
Mr. Holman Hunt, who has only lately finished a replica of his "Light of the World," which is to tour the world, recently entered upon his 87th year. As a very young boy he passed into the office of an auctioneer, and then went into the city office of a Manchester warehouseman. He sat by himself in a little room looking out on three blank walls through a window of ground glass, on which he drew flies, whose wings no doubt he regarded with envy. It is not without pathos that the happiest memory of that time of his life refers to the moment when, one morning, his employer said, "Shoo!" to the ink flies, and waved his handkerchief to disperse them. When he was sixteen or seventeen the boy triumphed so far as to persuade his father to let him practice painting for three days a week. For the untoward loneliness of his early years Fate made full amends to the painter. He had the luck to share his first studio with Rossetti; and in that bare room near Fitzroy square was founded the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood.

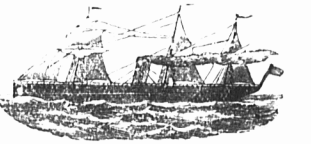
