STUDENTS HELP DR. GRENFELL

Will Take the Schooner Which Has Recently Been Built for Use in Mission Work. To the Labrador.

BOSTON, Mass., July 4.—Five Yale students who are willing to brave the rigors of the bleak and desolate Labrador coast that they may be of some assistance to Dr. Wilfrid Grenfell, the Arctic missionary, tonight boarded the sturdy little schooner Pomnik, tied up at Lewis ward, and with the rise of the sun will set sail for Battle Harbor, Labrador, stopping at Halifax en route.

COM. PEARY TO MEET PRESIDENT

NEW YORK, July 4.—Commander Robt. E. Peary, who is about to set forth on another exploring expedition to the Far North will go to Oyster Bay on Tuesday morning to pay his respects to President Roosevelt, and will remain until the afternoon to have luncheon with him. While the President and the explorer are dining, the Explorer's vessel, the Roosevelt, will bring the ship to Oyster Bay, and anchor a short distance from Sagamore Hill. After luncheon Peary will invite the President aboard the Roosevelt and if he accepts, he will probably will, the Explorer will take him on a tour of inspection. Just before the President goes aboard the Roosevelt a presidential salute will be fired, and when he has been taken ashore, the vessel will weigh anchor and start on the journey to Sydney, C. B., the first stopping place on the voyage to the Polar regions.

The schooner is thirty-six feet ten inches long over all and ten feet beam, and is equipped with a fifteen horsepower oil-burning engine, capable of making eight miles an hour. She has bulging bows, a square stern and short stubby masts, the tops of which are unsuited to the gales of Labrador. Altogether she is built to withstand gales and ice floes. The students have sufficient supplies to reach Halifax and will there take on more to enable them to reach the more northern port which is their ultimate destination, Battle Harbor. When the trip is over, Clark and Yates will remain for the summer in Labrador assisting Dr. Grenfell and studying the country. Rowland will spend some time in streams and lake fishing, while Richardson and Carpenter will return as soon as they are able to secure passage home.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of the family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section 160 acres, more or less.

Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of any intending homesteader. The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans.

(1) At least six months residence upon the cultivation of the land in each year for three years

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered by him in the vicinity such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the (father, or mother.)

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent or the district of such intention. Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, or intention to apply for patent.
