IN MEMORIAM. PETER GAUDET. There passed away at St. Anthony's on January 5, 1917, Peter Gaudet, aged 70 years. The late Mr. Gaudet had been ill only a few days of the most insidious and painful kind. All that medical aid and loving hands could do was done for him, but all to no avail. He was a man of cheerful disposition, strong in his friendship, and highly esteemed for his sterling Christian character. Few persons in the western part of the province were better known or more highly respected. A cheerful giver of the best that the human heart may command, his comforting voice, his silent charity, his soul full of sympathy for all good causes, will not soon be forgotten. In his illness he was frequently visited by his pastor, Rev. P. X. Gallant, and he had the consolation of receiving the last rites of the church shortly before he died. The deceased leaves to mourn, a sorrowing widow whose maiden name was Catherine Gallant; also one son, Gilbert of Boston, U. S. A., and two daughters, Mrs. John Gallant, St. Anthony's, and Mary Ann at home. The late Mr. Gaudet was an honored member of the Holy Family and of the Assumption Societies. His funeral on Sunday, the 7th inst., was very largely attended, testifying to the esteem in which the deceased was held by the community. The services at the Church and at the grave were conducted by the pastor, Rev. P. X. Gallant, assisted by Rev. Ronald MacDonald, Brae. The pall bearers were Messrs. Benoit Pitre, Paul Gallant, J. H. Blanchard, Dominic Gallant, Benoit Pitre and Gilbert Gallant. Our sincerest sympathy goes out to the bereaved family in this their hour of trial and affliction.—R. I. P.
