THE METHODIST MISSION SCHOOL

St. John, May 28.—The committee in charge of the Methodist summer school of missions of the New Brunswick and P. E. Island conference, met recently in the parlors of the Centenary church with Rev. G. M. Campbell in the chair. Correspondence in connection with the summer school, from Mr. Lodge of Charlottetown, president of the conference; Rev. Dr. Stevenson and Rev. Mr. Brecken of Toronto, and Rev. Mr. Glendenning, of Halifax, was read. Rev. Prof. Watson of Mount Allison, was present and was invited to sit with the committee.

Some attention was given to the general plans of the school, which will be held in St. John this year. Rev. Prof. Watson was requested to take charge of the department comprising the Rev. Mr. Brecken of Toronto and a Japanese student of Victoria College, Toronto, who will visit the Young People's Societies in June and the following month in New Brunswick and P. E. Island, the object being to increase the interest in missionary work of the church and to secure funds for the support of Rev. E. S. Henniger, who is laboring in Japan, and the sending of another missionary into the foreign field. The school will be held about the latter part of July.

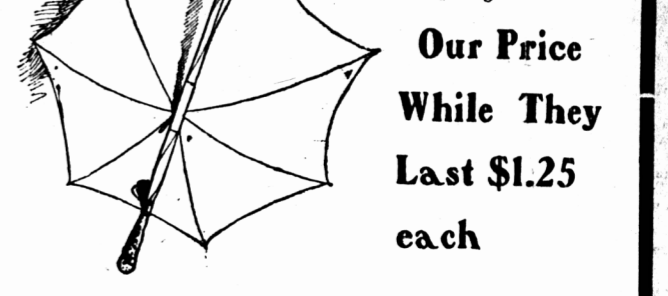
