THE DEFEAT OF MARTIN.

The British Columbia elections appear to have resulted in the defeat of Premier Martin by a large majority, though he is himself elected. According to the program which he laid down before the election the House should meet in July, in which case his term of power will be then cut short after a brief duration. But it is to be observed that though Martin's party is defeated there is not much evidence of cohesiveness in the Opposition elements elected, and there are many factors in British Columbia politics not very easily understood at this distance.

There has long been a controversy between Vancouver Island and the Mainland as to the proportion of representation allotted them. The two sections were united under one Legislature in 1866 and their unequal development since has led to frequent movements for readjusting their political relations. Any Administration must have a representation of both the Island and the Mainland in order to command success. Mining, lumbering and fishing interests must also be accorded adequate representation. Besides there are the grave questions of Chinese and Japanese immigration, and the relations between capital and labor, which are more acute in British Columbia than in any other Province. For these reasons less attention is all paid to Liberal and Conservative party lines than in other parts of Canada.

In this election while Martin is an Independent Liberal, and the leading spirits of the Opposition are Conservatives a considerable number of the Opposition candidates were Liberals who have opposed the introduction of party lines in provincial affairs. Hence it was that so prominent a Liberal as Hon. Fred Peters, formerly Premier in this Province, was active against Martin in the campaign just closed.

The result is not therefore a party victory in the full sense that the term is understood elsewhere in Canada. But doubtless throughout Canada Conservative feeling was pretty generally against Martin. This feeling was a strengthened by the fact that Governor McInnis had arbitrarily dismissed Premier Semlin (Conservative) in order to call Martin to form an Administration a few months ago.

Lieutenant Governor McInnis was appointed to his present position in November 1897. He was born in Nova Scotia in 1840, of Scottish Presbyterian parentage, graduated in medicine in 1869, practiced his profession for a time in Ontario and removed to New Westminster, B.C. in 1874. There he was elected to the Commons in 1878 and was called to the Senate by the Conservative Government in 1881. As the electorate has now expressed its disapprobation of the Governor's arbitrary act in dismissing his late advisers, it is presumed that he will at once resign the Governorship. Failing that he will no doubt be dismissed.

How British Columbia is forging ahead a few figures will show in a very strong light. In 1872, a year after joining the federation, the Province had a population, of 42,000 exclusive of Indians. It has now 180,000 exclusive of Indians. In 1872 the output of the mines, fisheries, forests, agriculture and animals and their products was in the aggregate but \$1,858,050. In 1879 it was eight times greater and in 1889 had increased to almost \$24,000,000. About one sixteenth of the entire trade of Canada is now done from the Pacific Coast.

THE QUEEN'S GOOD HEALTH.

Looks Her 81 Years, But Has Wonderful Vitality.

The Queen was 81 years old on Thursday, May 24th, and is well and hearty. In spite of her great age it is a commonplace in medical circles that her life is even now a better one from an insurance point of view than that of the Prince of Wales. It is true that she looks old, very old, very white and very bent. No one who has seen her lately could think for a moment that she was younger than her actual age.

Yet her health is good, her vitality is wonderful, and her mind as keen and vigorous as ever. Of course this is due to a great extent to her naturally splendid constitution. Until she was shaken by the death of the Prince Consort permanent good health seemed with the Queen to be a matter of course. After that date she gave ear to the doctors. For many years she has lived according to a few simple rules laid down for her by the late Sir William Jenner. About these rules there is nothing elaborate. A simple and careful diet, regularity and plenty of open-air life are the chief essentials. These three rules the Queen has observed strictly, the last one indeed for a time she rather over-observed. Practically no weather could prevent her from taking her long drives in an open carriage, and the royal doctors received many a fright on her account. At last, however, she received a fright herself a few years ago, and since then has been more careful.

The royal doctors, therefore, have discovered no great secret for the benefit of their august patient. Sir Francis Laking, one of the most eminent of them, when asked for some rules of life which would be conducive to longevity answered "Do anything you like, but do nothing to excess." Sir Samuel Wilks, another of the Queen's physicians, says:

"Everyone has a natural temperament. Follow that and avoid excesses. That's all. A quack may tell you you must eat an ounce of albumen, so much starch, so much water, and so on, and what should you do? Go and have a nice chop. The instincts of people are right. Jenner would have said to you: 'I never walk at all, except from house into my carriage. I hate walking and if I could I would get servants to carry me to bed.' That was Sir William Jenner, the Queen's eminent Physician; and what about exercise then? In the last three or four centuries we have done better intellectual work than ever before, and these have been the times of tea, coffee, tobacco and alcohol. What can you make of that? It is surprising. Again I say, follow your instincts."

Thus it would seem from the Queen's case that a strong will, regular habits and abstemious living are the roads to a strong old age.
