FINANCE

NEW YORK, May 13-(AP)—The stock market struggled feebly to hold a mild early rally today but light selling after mid-day converted initial gains of fractions to a point or so into declines in many cases at the close.

Canadian issues were mixed. Bell Telephone paced the gainer up 1 1/2 points to 97 and Walkers gained 5-8 while Distillers, Seagram and Bazillian Traction each rose 1-8. International Nickel was off 1-8 and Ford 3-8.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was unchanged at 40. Transfers totalled 431,850 shares compared with 425,320 yesterday.

Steels and rails, among stocks, weakened at the last with U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Santa Fe, N. Y., Central and Southern Pacific ending well under water. Other losers included Anaconda, U.S. Rubber, Montgomery Ward, American Telephone, Union Carbide, Consolidated Edison and U.S. Gypsum.

Du Pont was up 2 points and lesser improvement was shown for Westinghouse American Can Douglas Aircraft, J. I. Case, International Harvester, Western Union, Standard Oil of N.J. and Kennecott. General Motors and Chrysler were unchanged. Western Union directors, after the close, voted a dividend of \$1 a share on the common, the same as disbursed in December.

CHICAGO, May 13-(AP)—Wheat closed 1 5/8-2 cents above yesterday's finish today, May 97 1-8, July 95 3-8-1-2, corn was 7-6-1-8 up, May 72 5-8, July 72 1-8-3-4, oats 1-4-3-8 higher, soybeans 3-3-3-8 cents advanced, rye, 1-4 lower 1-4-5-8 higher, and lard 7-13 up.

Livestock

MONTREAL, May 13-(CP)—There were 116 cattle, 15 sheep and lambs, 900 hogs and 1,654 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today.

Yesterday's top cattle sales included 5 cows at \$7.25 one cow at \$7.50, one load of steers at \$9.15 and 4 steers at \$9.25.

Today's cattle were mostly cows at \$4.75 to \$7 for butcher cows. Canners and cutters were \$3.50 to \$4.50 and common to medium bulks \$4.50 to \$6.25.

Calf prices were 25 cents higher. Good quality veals were \$9 to \$9.50 with three selling up to \$10. Medium kinds were \$8 to \$8.50. Fair to medium in mixed lots around \$7.50.

The bulk of the calves were of common to just fair quality veals and drinkers and brought \$7 to \$7.75, with commoner kinds from \$6.75 to \$6.

Hogs were steady at \$12.50 for B-1 dressed, \$9.50 for B-1 alive fed and watered and \$9.60 off trucks delivered. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$5.50 to \$6.50 live weight.

TORONTO, May 13-(CP)—Base Metal stocks held to the up side in today's operations on the Toronto stock exchange. Turnover was 100,000 shares.

Hollinger was sold in sizable volume for a loss of a small fraction. Dome weakened 1-8. Bralorne 15 cents and losses of 2 to 5 cents were netted by Comlarum, Hard Rock, Pioneer and Sylvanite. The close was up for Beattie, Chesterville, Macassa, McKenzie, Preston, Pickle Crow, San Antonio and Upper Canada.

Base Metal stocks registered a gain of .15 in the index with higher prices showing at the close for Noranda, Sherritt and Pend Oreille. Bell Telephone featured the industrial department, advancing 6 points to 145. Imperial and International Petroleum added minimum fractions, the Loblaw issues firmed 1-4 to 1-2 and better prices were showing finally for Bank of Montreal, Canada Steamships, Canadian Breweries and Westons. The close was down narrowly for E.A. Oil, Steamships pfd, C.P.R., Cock-shutt Plow, Consolidated Bakers, Dominion Steel B and Fanny Farmer.

Home Oil weakened a cent to 1.65 and South End Pete was steady at 2 1-4.

MONTREAL, May 13-(CP)—The climb of Bell Telephone from its recent low towards higher ground provided the principal feature to trading on the stock exchange today. The issue jumped three points.

There were no market reactions to the announcement that the Dominion authorities have included newspaper companies among those considered as a "depressed industry." Papers were stronger but their rises occurred before the news was given out. Price Brothers and Baturat "A" participated in the rally.

Bulolo tried to lead mines into higher ground but the group failed to follow its advance though it was firm all through the session. National Steel Car was a strong spot in industrial and Canadian Locomotive also earned a small profit. Canadian Car preferred fell back.

Among electric issues, Montreal Power dropped a fraction and, in oils, Imperial was out in front and, in carriers, Canada Steamship firmed.

Dominion Textile scored the major loss of the day, ceding a point, and Sherritt Williams and Montreal Cottons preferred were other losers.
