The Portland Advertiser apparently thinks reciprocity between Canada and the States would be a good thing...

Sir Wilfrid did not mean that he and the Canadian people do not still desire reciprocal trade with our neighbors...

But Sir Wilfrid, his party, and a large body of Canadian people would gladly see their way to obtaining a fair reciprocity treaty...

It is to be remembered that if the majority of the people of Canada desired such a treaty, as they do, and if at the same time the majority of our neighbors earnestly desired the same...

What we sell principally to our neighbors now are the products of our forests, mines and fisheries. A treaty that would propose to give us a free market in the States for our lumber, fish and coal...

The chances are therefore very small indeed that our representatives

will be able to secure a fair reciprocity treaty that would have a chance to pass the ordeal of the Washington Senate.

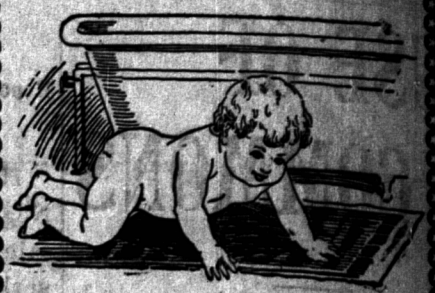
