A severe encounter ensued, resulting in a victory for the Italians. Nearly all the Bedouins were left dead on the battlefield. The Italians lost 12 dead and 30 were wounded.

BRITAIN TO RAISE BIG NAVAL LOAN

LONDON, Nov. 30—The probability of a big naval loan in the near future is revived by the Pall Mall Gazette which anticipates that \$150,000,000 and possibly more will be raised, supplemental to the usual naval estimates. It is argued that in view of the campaign in Germany for increased navy for that country, it is necessary for Great Britain to show that she is determined to preserve the "2 to 1" standard. The provision of adequate docks for the dreadnought battleships also necessitates heavy expenditures.
