Miss Isabella McQuarrie of Scarbortown left yesterday for Harding, Mass to resume her studies as nurse in Medfield Hospital.


At a meeting of the Summerside School Board on Tuesday evening, W. T. Burrows was appointed secretary, vice, G. B. Morris, resigned.

**WHEN MEN WERE SLAVES FOR LIFE**

LONDON, May 1.—Two hundred years ago, when men and women were condemned to death for trivial offences, it was the custom in Scotland to commute the death sentence into perpetual servitude to specified masters. In other words, the condemned person became a slave. It was further ordained that he should wear a metal collar round his neck recording his sentence and punishment. The society of Scottish antiquaries owns one of these collars, fished out of the Forth above Alloa. It is of brass, with this inscription: "Alexander Stewart, found guilty of death for theft, at Perth, 7th December, 1701, and gifted by the Justiciars as a perpetual servant to Sir John Aresken of Alva."

**THE DIAMONDS OF RHODESIA**

CAPE TOWN, May 1.—Sir John Wills has given an account of the remarkable discovery made recently in Rhodesia of diamonds and other precious stones. Only a limited commencement had been made on a new deposit, when, as he states, in the course of only thirty days work, out of one thousand five hundred loads washed there had been found diamonds, sapphires, rubies, etc., of more than three thousand carats, or fully two carats per load. The discovery was made between the two main rivers of Matabeland.
