MINISTER LEAVES BAPTIST CHURCH

St. JOHN, March 15.—Rev. William A. Taylor, who has been supplying in Leinster street Baptist church St. John, N. B. since December, has left the Baptist denomination and joined the Christian church. He was extended the right hand of fellowship at a meeting of the Coburg street Christian church and will undertake evangelical work in this province of Nova Scotia.

"There is so little difference," he continued, "between the two churches that it is really not much of a change. The Christian church platform is broader but its views are in perfect accord with those of the Baptist community. I consider the church stands on the best platform for Christian unity. It recognizes, as do the Baptists, the authority of the New Testament."

Rev. Mr. Taylor said it was his intention to take up evangelistic work with the Christian body in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

Rev. William A. Taylor was ordained a minister in the Baptist communion at Detroit in 1885. He came to St. John from Springfield (Mass.) last December and has since been supplying in Leinster street church owing to the vacancy caused by Rev. C. Burnett leaving for the west.

SEA-SICKNESS MAY BE CURED

NEW YORK, March 15.—Dr. Wildmann, is the discoverer of the weirdest method to counteract sea-sickness.

To many the remedy would seem worse than the ill.

The person affected must stand up, with the feet about twelve inches apart, near some fixed support such as a vertical rod or bar half an inch in diameter, which must be firmly grasped with both hands.

The patient should then begin a series of movements with the object of effecting an uninterrupted but slow and gentle massage of the abdominal parts.

This massage is obtained by giving the abdomen alternate backward and forward and forward and backward movements, at a speed and amplitude at first very restricted, or, if preferred, the movements can be made from right to left, then from left to right. In executing this exercise one must take care to look steadily at the horizon or at some distant point not affected by the oscillation of the ship. If it is possible to find one. In any case, one must not look at one's feet.

GRAND TRUNK WILL MAKE FIGHT

MONTREAL, March 15.—The Grand Trunk Railway threatens to institute a rate war against the Vanderbilt lines, unless the Michigan Central foregoes its intention to retire from the agreement made 11 years ago between the Vanderbilt Lines and the G. T. R. by which the Grand Trunk had an advantage of \$2 over the Vanderbilt roads, on the rate from Chicago to New York and Boston. The Michigan Central has been content with the situation till recently, when it announced that it would not continue to grant the \$2 advantage to the Grand Trunk contending it was not a Vanderbilt line and that it had not, as had the Vanderbilt and Grand Trunk lines, direct entrance to Manhattan Island and consequently to New York. The Grand Trunk holds that the Michigan Central being closely allied with the Vanderbilt system, had the privilege of landing their freight in bulk in New York just as if it had an entrance of its own. The matter will be placed in the hands of the Intra-State Commerce Commission to adjudicate on. If the Grand Trunk's views are not met, this railway will fight the Vanderbilt lines to a finish.

STRONG CHANCES NOW FOR PEACE

LONDON, March 15.—The Algerias correspondent of The Times cables as follows: After days of reflection, the favorable impression made by the Austrian proposal remains intact. Though it can hardly be accepted in its present form, it shows a decided change in the attitude of Germany, for no one doubts that the proposals emanated from Berlin. Until yesterday Germany had shown herself so unbending that her professions of a strong desire for an amicable solution were received here with extreme skepticism, and there was a universal conviction that for the rupture which seemed inevitable she must be held responsible. All this is now changed, and it is to be hoped France will continue to show the spirit of conciliation in which she has hitherto conducted negotiations.
