May Be Within 2 Miles Of Rhine

PARIS, March 1.—(AP)—The United States 9th Army today swiftly captured the Ruhr city of Muenchen Gladbach—largest Reich centre to fall on the eastern or western front—and the German radio said tanks slashed 11 miles farther north into Krefeld, only two miles from the Rhine.
