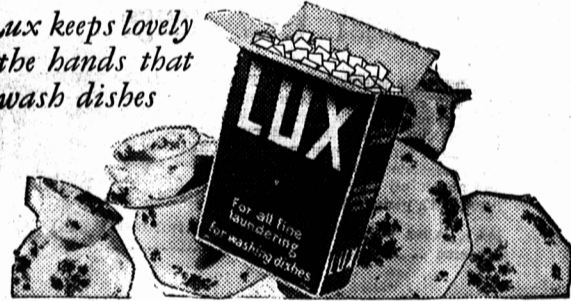

### Shipping Club News

During the past week five cars of live stock were handled by the Island clubs. In view of the present good price for lambs, many clubs are marketing this class of live stock quite freely. Over 1,000 head have been shipped out of the province during the past six weeks. There has been a keen demand for lambs at 14c delivered. It is hoped that many farmers will ship their lambs while the price remains comparatively high. Keeping them until October or November is a sure way to weaken the market at that time.

All farmers having buck lambs should ship them before Sept. 15th, after which date a heavy cut will be made. The past week has been one of great significance to Maritime swine growers. In years past farmers noted the discrepancy between Montreal and Maritime hog prices. Last week for the first time in the history of the local swine industry, Maritime prices were higher than Montreal. Montreal quoted around .13 1-2c, while Maritime packers paid .14c to the Shipping Clubs on a delivered basis.

The Shipping Clubs are rendering a valuable service to the live stock producers in that live stock of any class may be shipped at the time when prices are high. A good market for veal calves has been made available to the farmers. It is hoped that many will take advantage of this, and thus prevent the wasteful slaughter of young calves for little more than the value of the hide.

Calves should not be shipped when under one month, and to secure the prevailing top price of .9c they should weigh around 200 pounds.

A considerable number of cattle are being shipped through the clubs. Last week the Ugg Club loaded about thirteen head, while the Greenwood Club will ship a car load during the present week.

In view of the high hog prices and the almost assured low prices of feeds during the coming fall and winter, it is anticipated that sucker pigs will be at a great premium. To meet this demand a large number of bred sows will be offered at the Swine Show & Sale, which will be held in Charlottetown, October two and three. Farmers should plan to attend this event, and fill their requirements in both boars and sows. An extra brood sow will be a good investment during the next year or two. It is to be regretted that many farmers sold their brood sows during the past spring. Many boar owners report that only one-third of the usual number of sows were bred for fall litters. Sows bred to farrow in January or February would help to meet this scarcity.

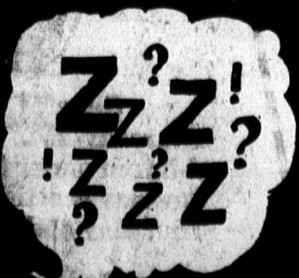
