PARCEL MAIL.—The first direct parcel mail from Canada to British Honduras per Canadian government Merchant Marine will leave Halifax per S. S. Canadian Forester on the 2nd March next and there will be a direct despatch three weeks thereafter from Halifax in winter and Montreal in summer.

HIGHEST AVERAGE ON LONDON SALES.—Mr. Ernest Champson, lately of Alberton, but now of Cavendish, Charlottetown has received a letter from Alfred Fraser of New York congratulating Mr. Champson on receiving the highest average for five silver black fox pelts sold on the last sale held by C. M. Lamson of London, the average being 100 pounds. In February, 1918 Mr. Champson had the distinction of selling a fox pelt that sold for the highest price on Lamson's sale of that date, the price being 135 pounds. In May, 1919 he had two pelts sold for 190 pounds each and another for 170 pounds. Mr. Champson although now living in Charlottetown still retains his fox ranch in Alberton where he has been engaged in the fox business for the past twelve years.
