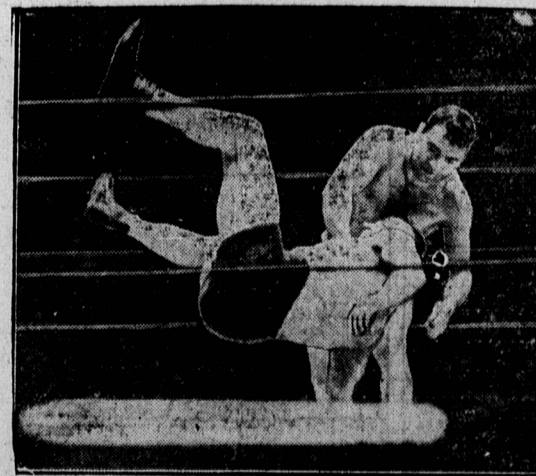
READY FOR SHOOT AT BISLEY

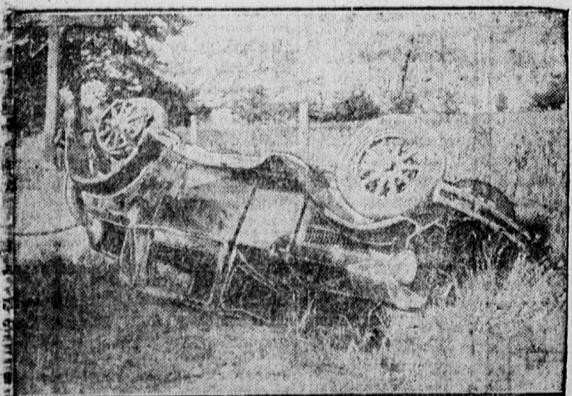
WITH JACKIE COOGAN

Miss Dorothea Danson, one of prettiest of France's younger set, with Tiger II, with which she recently won first prize at the horse show in the French capital.



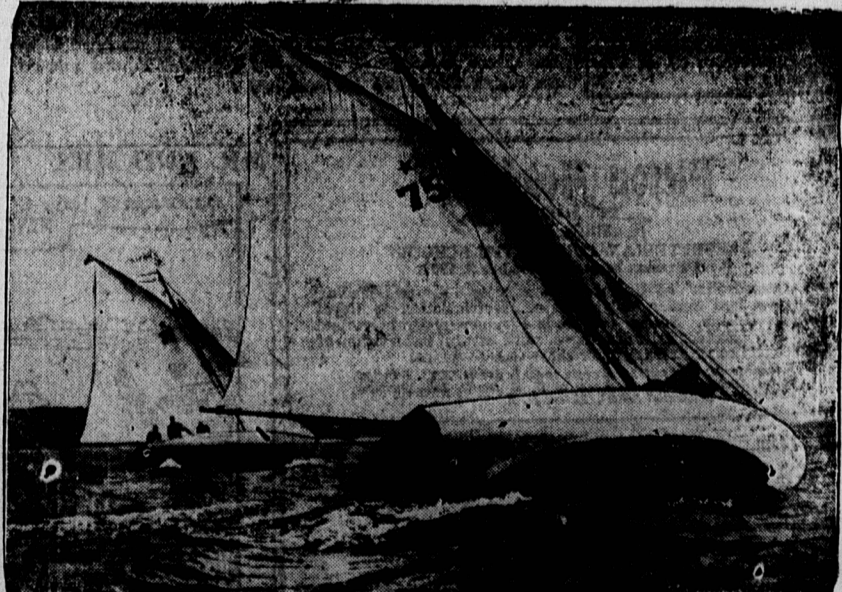
RUMBLE SEAT RIDER INJURED
