WILL THERE BE A RUSSIAN SEDAN?

Report that Kuroki is now in Kuropatkin's Rear—Japs Occupy Hai Cheng without Resistance, also New Chwang—Russian Retreat Continues—Silence at St. Petersburg.

THE RUSSIANS SURROUNDED. LONDON, Aug. 4.—(Special)—It is believed that General Kuroki with a hundred thousand men is now behind the Russian forces and General Oku on their front with General Nodzu on their left. JAPS OCCUPY HAI CHENG. The Japanese have occupied Hai Cheng. ALSO NEW CHWANG, IN FORCE. The Russians began abandoning Hai Cheng August 2nd and the Japanese entered without resistance at noon on Wednesday. They have also occupied New Chwang in force. RUSSIANS HOPE FOR DELAY. The Russians believe that Japanese will not resume their advance for several days yet, until they are ready to continue their flanking operations on a large scale. RUSSIANS RETREATING NORTHWARD. The Russian retreat northward continues. AN OMINOUS SILENCE. Complete and ominous silence prevails at St. Petersburg regarding events at the front since the receipt of General Kuropatkin's brief despatches on Aug. 2nd. [It may be doubted whether General Kuroki has yet reached a point where he can occupy and cut the railway in rear of General Kuropatkin. It is quite clear however that the situation is perilous for Kuropatkin and that the Russian forces have had all the fighting they want and are retreating northward, no doubt closely followed by General Oku's and Nodzu's forces. The occupation of Hai Cheng by the Japanese without resistance gives them entire possession of the railway from Port Arthur northward for 175 miles. The rainy season has caused no cessation of hostilities so far, and seems not likely to in the future except for a few days at a time. The full possession of New Chwang by the Japanese immensely increases the facilities for supplying their three armies in the north, while at the same time depriving the Russians of that advantage and making them almost wholly dependent upon the Siberian railway for everything. There may well be an ominous silence at St. Petersburg.]
