THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

ALL FIT CANADIANS CAN BE CALLED TO FOLLOW FLAG ANYWHERE UNDER THE SUN

Geo. F. Henderson, K.C., Gives Legal Opinion on Subject About Which There is so Much Discussion at the Present Time.

The following article on compulsory service was written by Mr. George F. Henderson, K. C.

The average Canadian seems to be quite wrong in his ideas of the liability to military service of the men of Canada. He thinks that our only system of military service is the volunteer system, and that the enforcement of what he probably calls "conscription" would require new legislation. Even such a well informed newspaper as The Evening Journal (January 25th) suggests, though not editorially, that this "conscription" is forbidden by the B. N. A. Act.

"IN POINT OF FACT, THE LAW OF CANADA IS AND HAS BEEN SINCE THE DAYS OF THE OLD PROVINCES WHICH ANTIDATED CONFEDERATION, THAT EVERY PHYSICALLY FIT MAN (WITH A FEW SPECIFIED EXCEPTIONS) BETWEEN THE AGES OF EIGHTEEN AND SIXTY, IS LIABLE TO BE CALLED OUT FOR MILITARY SERVICE IN CASE OF WAR, INVASION, RIOT OR INSURRECTION, REAL OR APPREHENDED."

This is the central idea of the Militia Act of Canada, Chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906. True it is that in Canada, as until recently in England, the authorities have not thought it wise to put the provisions of this Act into force, but none the less they are, and always have been, the law of the land, since the land had any law.

Neither is this anything new to the Anglo-Saxon. In Great Britain also "the principle of compulsory military service obligatory upon every able-bodied male person between the ages of sixteen and sixty, has always been and still is the fundamental principle of English law, both common law and statute law. It has been obscured by the pernicious, voluntary principle, which, in the much abused name of liberty, has shifted a universal national duty upon the shoulders of the patriotic few. But it has never been revoked or repudiated. These are the words of Professor Hearnshaw in the London Morning Post of 25th August, 1915, and they are well supported by authority—Freeman, the eminent author of "The Norman Conquest," speaks of "the right and duty of every free Englishman to be ready for the defence of the Commonwealth, with arms befitting his own degree in the Commonwealth." Grose, in his "Military Antiquities," says that "by the Saxon laws every freeman of an age capable of bearing arms, and not incapacitated by any
