Births in Island

More Than Doubled Deaths Last Year

The vital statistics section of the report indicated that deaths totalled 928 and births 2,067. In the same time there were 770 marriages. The figures were not complete, however, the report said, and listed them as tentative.

The 1941 figures while there were fewer deaths and more marriages. Births in 1941 totalled 2,069, deaths, 1,134 and marriages, 673.

The report, the 14th from the Department of Health, is tabled in the Legislature by Hon. Mark E. McGuigan, Minister of Health.

A drop in the number of deaths from tuberculosis based on the 100-000 population unit was indicated although the figures for this year were not given. The tentative rate was 1.2 per 1,000 compared with 1.5 last year and 10.5 in 1934, the highest in the last ten years.

The total number of cases of communicable diseases was approximately the same as for the year preceding but there was a "marked decrease" in the number of deaths from that source. The decrease in deaths most noticeable were from pneumonia and tuberculosis. And although the figures were only tentative, the complete returns "not being obtainable yet" the final figures "will assuredly be much lower than for past years."

During the year 1,134 children were immunized against diphtheria, and of that number almost 3,000 were of pre-school age.

The co-operation of parents was "moderately good," the report said, but "it could be better and it should be a hundred per cent."

During the year, too, 1,700 children were vaccinated against smallpox. "I am pleased to report," Dr. E. C. Keating, Deputy Minister of Health said, "that our Province has been absolutely free from this disease for more than 15 years."
