SOLDIERS ARRIVE.—A detachment of a hundred men from the 105th Battalion arrived in Souris on Tuesday and are now comfortably established in the Barracks at the corner of Main and Church Sts. They are under the command of Capt. W. E. Hardy and Lieut. T. M. Fullerton and J. G. Kelly. Lieut. Corcoran, of the Army Service Corps, Halifax, is also attached and had charge of all the stores and equipment of the barracks pending the arrival of the half company.
