THE THAW CASE.

NEW YORK, May 16-No decision has been announced by Justice Keogh in regard to whether he will impanel a jury to assist him next month in determining the mental status of Harry K. Thaw. Thaw seeks release from the State Hospital for the Criminal Insane at Matteawan on the plea that if he ever was insane he has recovered his sanity.

In any event the battle at White Plains promises to be as hard fought as any that have preceded it in Thaw's behalf. The State may be reinforced by new evidence, including a letter written by Thaw to one of his confidential agents in New York in December, 1903, in which he gives instructions for the watching of Stanford White and Frederick Gehard. He also betrays in the letter great interest in the physical exercises he has heard have been taken up by J. C. Bancroft Davis, a member of the Knickerbocker Club.

On a page of the letter opposite the rest of the text is a list reading "Bancroft Davis, Kill; Freddy Gehard, Kill; Stanford White, Kill; Craig Wadsworth, Reginald Francklyn." The reasons, if any, why Thaw should have used the names of Mr. Gehard, Mr. Bancroft or Mr. Francklyn, have not been revealed.

MAY HAVE STARVED.

NEW YORK, May 16-That some of the passengers of the steamer Titanic starved to death in open boats after they had escaped from the sinking vessel, was made terribly probable this morning with the arrival here of the White Star liner Oceanic from Southampton. In a collapsible life raft which the Oceanic sighted and picked up on Monday night at 12.15 p. m., were found three bodies all in such a condition that they were committed to the sea as soon as the burial service could be over them. The bodies were of men and one of them, that of a fireman, was chained by the leg to a thwart in one end of the boat, while the two others were huddled in the other end. In their mouths were small pieces of cork, which, Dr. R. S. French, of the Oceanic's staff, believes the victims chewed in their delirium to ease the pain of hunger and thirst. News of the finding of these bodies was reported briefly by wireless last night.
