AMPLE AND COMPLETE PREPARATIONS FOR THE DOMINION EXHIBITION.

Preparations on a grand scale are being made by the Commission for the Dominion Exhibition which will open its gates in Halifax to the public on September 2nd, and keep them open for two weeks.
The new Administration Building for the Grand Entrance will be erected on the same plans as though the recent proceedings in Court regarding expropriation had not taken place, but the building will be located on a site different from that proposed. The public will be in no wise inconvenienced by the change. Should the occasion ever arise, under which another site for this building should be determined upon, the edifice will easily be moved, and construction of the foundations will be such that this can be done without difficulty. The new building will be erected close to the other new buildings added during last year to the splendid equipment on the Exhibition Grounds.
An important change that the Commission are making for the Dominion Fair is the placing of the Judging Rings and Judges' Stands for all live-stock within the race track enclosure. This will effect a material improvement and will be a change that will be appreciated.

REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES.

For the purposes of the Act for Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages, the Province has been divided into the following Districts and the undermentioned persons have been appointed District Registrars of Births and Deaths for the several Districts.
Marriages must be registered in the office of the Registrar General within thirty days of such marriage.
Deaths occurring in Charlottetown, Summerside and Georgetown, must be registered before burial. Deaths occurring in other Districts must be registered within Seven (7) days of their occurrence.
Births must be registered within Thirty (30) days of their occurrence.
SECTION 17.
Every duly qualified medical practitioner who was last in attendance, during the last illness of any person, shall within Forty eight hours after having notice or knowledge of the death of such person, transmit by Post, prepaid to the District Registrar of the District in which the death took place, a Certificate under his signature, or the cause of death according to the form in "Schedule B" to this Act annexed, to be provided by the said District Registrar, and it shall be the duty of every such Medical Practitioner to apply to the said District Registrar for blank forms for that Purpose.
SECTION 34.
Any person who knowingly or wilfully makes or causes to be made, any false statement touching any of the particulars required to be reported and entered under this Act shall upon conviction thereof forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty (40) dollars.
SECTION 35.
If any Householder, head of a family, Clergyman, Physician or other person or persons required by this Act to report Births, Deaths, and Marriages refuses or wilfully neglects to do so within the time named, shall upon conviction for each and every offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty (20) Dollars and costs.
The fees required to be paid to the District Registrars under this Act, for registration of Births and Deaths are paid by the Provincial Government.
