GRAIN

Winnipeg, Feb. 5—(CP)—Absence of selling pressure, together with light buying held futures prices well above the previous close on Winnipeg grain exchange. Quotations ended 3-8-5 cent higher. May at 84 3/4, Jy 85 1-2 and Oct 86 1-2 cents.

Chicago wheat values climbed about a cent while Buenos Aires traders were on holiday.

CHICAGO, Feb. 5—(AP)—Wheat and corn price gains of a cent a bushel or more today imparted strength to the entire grain market.

Buying based on unfavorable reports of winter crop conditions in the northern hemisphere bolstered wheat while the corn market, depressed by a glut from export business, declined 1/2 cent to 3 points.

International Nickel, up a fraction, bucked a general bear trend among Canadian issues. Fractionally lower were Distillers Seagram, Dome, Marconi, Ford, Imperial Tobacco and Massey Harris.

Livestock

MONTREAL, Feb. 5—(CP)—Lamb and cows were steady on Montreal livestock market today but other kinds of livestock were lower. Receipts were 601 cattle, 7-116 calves, 1,145 hogs and 182 sheep and lambs.

Good steers were \$7.25 to \$7.50 medium mostly \$6.25 to \$7.25 and common \$5 to \$6. Heifers ranged from \$4.50 to \$6.50, good butcher cows were \$5.50 with an odd top at \$5.75, medium kinds made from \$4.50 to \$5.25 and common \$3.75 to \$4.25. Canners and cutters were \$3 to \$3.50, common bulls were \$4 to \$5.25 and butchers bulls around \$5.50.

Calves were 50 to 75 cents or more lower. Good veals made \$11.50 with common thin veals down to \$8. The bulk of the sales were made between \$9 and \$10.50. Drinkers were \$6 to \$7. Grassers made the bulk of the offerings and were sold from \$4.50 to \$5.25 mostly \$5.

Lambs were steady at \$8.50 to \$9 for mixed lots of mostly bucks. Sheep were \$3.50 to \$6 averaging close to \$5.50.

TORONTO, Feb. 5—(CP)—Gold shares drifted down to their low price level since before Christmas as the industrialists posted moderate declines today on the Toronto stock exchange. Base metal stocks closed slightly above Saturday's first prices. Trading showed no improvement on last week's dull tempo and turnover aggregated only 251,000 shares.

Most trading was in the cheaper golds. Industrials and base metals were dull. Steel, food and utility stocks closed flat. Point declines were netted by Canadian Breweries pfd, B. C. Power "A", Lang and Sons and National Steel Car. C. P. R. came through in considerable volume at an advance of 3-8 to 6-8. Ford A, Massey-Harris, B. A. Oil, Fanny Farmer and Loblaw B were weak.

Gold shares showed an index setback of 51. Wright-Cargreaves finished 15 cents down at 7.90 and losses of 4 cents or more were netted by Central Patricia, Little Long Lac, O'Brien, Moneta and Siscon. Minor gains showed for Aunor, Conlaum, East Malartic, MacLeod-Cochshutt, Malartic, Sylvanite and Teck Hughes.

Steep Rock advanced 7 cents to 2.33. Sheritt gained 2 cents and W. S. Falconbridge lost 5 cents. Senior base metal shares held steady.

In dull trading the western oil group eased off slightly. Home firm of a few cents but failed to hold the gain. Royalite at 33 1/2 for a broken lot was a bit lower and Anglo-Canadian slipped a cent to 93.
