ents, or who need means of correction and education other than those which are supplied at home ought therefore, to engage the attention of all persons—men and women—who have at heart the future of this Province and of the large Dominion of which it is a small but not insignificant part. If the activities of the Red Cross Society in the sphere of public health and the promotion of juvenile growth and correction could be linked with those of a Children's Aid Society for the whole Province and all the Social Service for the Province administered under one of the Departments of the Provincial Government, the situation in this regard would be considerably improved at little if any, additional expense on the part of the public.
