Dal Announces New Scholarships

Dalhousie University has announced the establishment of five new Entrance Scholarships in the Faculty of Medicine. These will be made available to students entering for the Session of 1947-48. Each Scholarship will have a value of \$500.00 and the recipients will be students of the Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland who have completed their premedical studies with outstanding scholastic records. They will be awarded on a regional basis: One to a student, resident of Cape Breton Island; two for students resident on the mainland of Nova Scotia; one to a student resident of New Brunswick; one to a student resident of either Prince Edward Island or Newfoundland. In announcing the proposed award, the University stated that it was designed to encourage students to enter the study of Medicine who were scholastically capable, but that no award would be made unless it was shown that the candidate bore a reputation for truthfulness, unselfishness and idealism of a type likely to produce an honourable, as well as a capable, physician.

Stan Francis' Show "Goes Over Big" At Halifax

(From The Halifax Herald, June 19th) "Fun was really fizin'" at the Forum last evening when Stan Francis, famed for his radio broadcast, "Share the Wealth", opened his two-day engagement at the Forum. "Sponsored by the Junior League of Halifax, with proceeds for the work of the Children's Library, the show spotlighted such well-known entertainers as singing star Rus Titus, magician Ron Leonard and the pianist and accordionist, Dorothy Merrall. "Haligonians joined in the show and a score were rewarded with blankets, toasters and other prizes. "Topping the evening's entertainment was the auction when people in the audience bid for and got such things as a fowl, wash tub, ladder, strings of sausages, among other surprise packages. When they headed home with these articles they created an interesting diversion on the city streets. "The show opened with a parade of Junior Leaguers blowing on whistles and brandishing banners which proclaimed the coming of Stan Francis. "Quick moving and reminiscent of vaudeville, one of the show's bright spots was the sleight of hand of magician Ron Leonard whose smooth patter and deft hands had his audience completely fooled. "Stan Francis himself as master of ceremonies fulfilled the promise of sparkling personality that his radio voice gives and his haranguing of the audience only increased their admiration. "This popular "Share-the-Wealth" show sponsored by the local Y's Men's Club for their work among the youth is scheduled for Charlottetown for next Monday evening and a capacity crowd is expected to make their way to the Forum. Before the main show the popular "Down Towners" orchestra will present a program of popular music.
