THE COOK'S CORNER

BUTTERSCOTCH COOKIES

One cup butter, 2 cups light brown sugar, 2 eggs, unbeaten, 1-2 cups flour, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1-2 teaspoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon vanilla. When eggs are expensive use only one and add 2 tablespoons of milk. This is for either rolled or ice-box cookies, but I drop it from a teaspoon and press down with fork dipped in hot water. Bake in moderate oven, 375-400 degrees, until light brown. This recipe can be varied by adding raisins, chopped nuts, coconut or chopped peel of dates. I use vegetable shortening and add more salt. This isn't a page recipe, but I'm sure the neighbors will like it.

REAL CLAM CHOWDER

To make clam chowder take 1 quart clams, 1 quart sliced potatoes 1 onion cut fine, 1-4 pound salt pork, 1 quart milk. Fry out pork diced, then place potatoes in kettle with the fat and cold water (the clam water which has been drained from the clams) and cook until clams and potatoes are tender. Then add season with salt and pepper and hot milk.

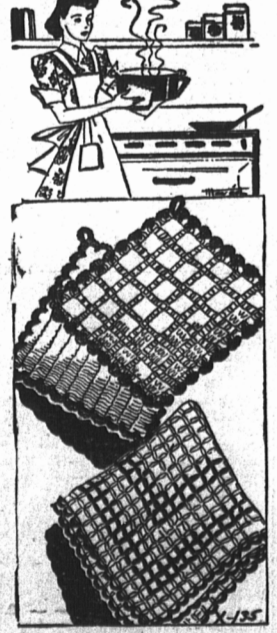
CHEESE FINGERS

One-half cup grated bread crumbs, 1-2 cup flour, 3-4 cup nippy cheese (grated), 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, a dash of cayenne, 2 tablespoons shortening, very little water. Roll thin and bake in moderate oven.
