THE PALACE POSTMASTER. Never Absent From His Post in a Quarter of a Century.

Mr. Pike, the postmaster of the Palace of Westminster, who will retire shortly under the age limit, after holding that responsible position for more than a quarter of a century, has never been absent for a single hour from his duties on account of sickness, according to the Chronicle, and this in spite of the fact that for many years he was always at his post at 11 o'clock in the morning and did not leave it until an hour or so after the adjournment of the Commons.

Cost of Englishman's Shooting.

The extent to which the letting of moors and forests has become recognized as a regular source of income to lord and laird alike in the Highlands, may be judged from the increase in the number of deer forests now annually let. Twenty years ago there were 90 recognized forests. A recent report from the Crofters Commission showed 109 of these forests. To-day there are 150. Shootings and forests which let for upwards of £400 or £500 a year may be counted by hundreds. In the two Counties of Argyll and Inverness alone there are a dozen forests whose rentals average £2,500.

The foregoing is typical of the rise in rents which has resulted from the eager competition for forests and moors, Inverness, when it was good enough to afford a bag of 75 brace to one man and a dog, fetched £50 now it is a four-figure shooting. Mr. Geo. A. Cooper is paying £5,500 for his forest, £4,700 to Sir G. Munro-Graham for his share of Gleneshie, and £800 to the Mackintosh for his portion. M. Achilles Fould has Invermark at £3,850; Mr. William Weir, Achnacarry for £2,000; Lord Burton, Glenquoich for £2,022; Mr. Frank Bibby, Mamore for £2,500. For Invercauld, £5,000 for the season is asked. For £23,000 less, Runect is let. At about £2,000 many moors and forests are now being used.
