Out of love and affection for the east, or in order to more handsomely feather their own nests? To the objection that the western grain growers will control the organization, the Guide throws out different baits. First it says, "Naturally this cannot be done if there is no affiliation with Western farmers." Just so, and that is why our farmers are refusing to join an organization in affiliation with them. Then it says, "The men who have perfected the egg and produce marketing system of Prince Edward Island have shown sufficient acumen to protect their wider interests." That is true, intensely true, and they are showing that "acumen" by refusing to hand these interests they have worked up over to the tender mercies of the Western Combine. We fully agree with the Guide in this, that "Any suggestion that they will allow themselves to be exploited a little, if any, short of a GRATUITOUS INSULT." It is because of this that the Guide is thus pleading, but in vain, for them to link themselves up with the exploiters of the West and the Grain Growers combine.
