LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Nov. 10--(CP)--Cattle receipts on the Montreal live stock market today totalled 1,638. Calf receipts were 85, sheep receipts 2,411 and hog receipts 1,661.
Prices were fairly steady on all grades of livestock.
Good steers sold from \$8.75 to \$9.50, medium \$7 to \$8.25, and common from \$5 to \$6.75. Heifers ranged from \$4.50 to \$6. Good cows sold around \$5.50 there, but few top, medium were from \$5.25 to \$6, and common from \$4.50 to \$5. Canners and cutters were \$3.50 to \$4.25. Bulls were \$4.50 to \$5.50 for common.
Calves were steady to 25 cents higher in spots. Veals ranged from \$9 to \$13. Good veals were \$12.50 up, medium kinds \$11.50 to \$12.50 and fair veals around \$11. Drinkers were \$8.50 to \$8.50. Heavy calves were slow sellers. Grassys \$5 to \$6 mostly \$5.50 to \$5.75.
Lamb were unchanged at \$11 for good ones and \$10.50 for medium and culls were cut \$2 per hundredweight. Sheep were from \$3.50 to \$6.50 mostly \$5.50 to \$6.25.
Hogs were steady at \$15 for fat and \$11.25 for B and C. Fed and watered and up to \$11.35 off trucks delivered. Grade A dress \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were slower selling from \$8 to \$8.50 tops \$9 live weight.

To-Go Exchange

TORONTO, Nov. 10--(CP)--Mining stocks had a sizable setback today on the Toronto exchange, the golds leading the decline with a loss of 1.24 in the index and the base metals issues weakening 42. Western oils were down .15 at the close and the industrials were up .05. Turnover of 136,000 shares showed little change from recent dull markets. The exchange will remain closed tomorrow to observe Remembrance Day.

Part of the weakness in the golds was charged to the threat of a strike in the Kirkland Lake field though the stocks representing other mining districts showed the greater weakness. The stocks of the eight mines where the men are likely to be called out came through today's market as follows: Teck Hughes, Kirkland Lake and Toronto, unchanged; Lake Shore down 1-2; Chryse down 20 cents, Sylvanite down 6 cents and Bidgood-Kirkland down 1 3-4 cents. Wight-Hargreaves firm 2 cents.
Compared with the Kirkland Lake losses were 5-8 for Dome to a new low for the year 10 1/2 15 cents for Buffalo-Ankerite, Kerr-Addison and Preston and 4 to 6 cents for Chesterville, Auncr, Maric, Goss, Fields and McKenzie.
Most of the base metal stocks moved in light volume. Steep Rock was fairly active on a gain of 4
