Pledges Aid To Maintaining World Peace

(By The Canadian Press)
OTTAWA, Jan. 10 — The solid name of Gen. Eisenhower and all it means in Allied weight and strength was perpetuated in the towering eminence and enduring rock of a Canadian mountain today as the famous Allied Supreme Commander dedicated the remainder of his life to maintaining peace.

At a press conference and in a speech at a luncheon the theme of collaboration and international understanding dominated the General's remarks. His throaty voice and nervous delivery do not make him an orator, but audiences were impressed by his earnestness as he set a purposeful law to talk of continuing world responsibility for carrying successful co-operation during the war into the peace.

At the press conference he pledged: "I want to devote the rest of my life with what small talents I have, to maintaining what the soldiers died to gain—that is, peace."

He cited Canada and the United States as ideal examples of what could be done in the way of international collaboration. The military leaders of both countries in the territorial integrity of North America.

The General reiterated his well known policy of not making comparisons about various national troops under his command. He added that he would not be could tell Canadians from Americans. "This," he said, "was meant as a compliment, although you probably won't agree."

In his luncheon speech he spoke of "my own days when I had no one could command a force that included Canadians without feelings of deep humility and lasting pride."
