THE ODDS ARE NOW IN FAVOR OF HUGHES

The Significance of The Utterance of Secretary Root. Why The President Did The Unusual Thing-- His Words Have Created a Sensation.

New York, Nov. 3.—The campaign reached white heat yesterday when the speech of Elihu Root at Utica last night was spread before the voters. The tremendous arraignment of Hearst as the instigator of the assassination of President McKinley made the issue stark and clear. The fact that the secretary of state spoke with the direct authority of President Roosevelt gave his words an overwhelming force. It is absolutely unprecedented that a president of the United States should intervene so decidedly in a local campaign. It was characteristic of Roosevelt, that when he acted he should do so with all his might.

There were days when McKinley lay dying at Buffalo that Hearst hid himself in actual fear. His newspapers were boycotted by nearly all respectable clubs and organizations in the country. He had thought he had lived that down, and even in the streets of the present campaign his opponents have handed him with gloves treating him gently in regard to his past. There has seemed to be a general timid fear of "rousing the animals."

Roosevelt has shaken off this timidity and has laid the issue clear at one stroke as between the forces of anarchy and the forces of responsible government. The prevailing view is that while Roosevelt may have aroused sympathy for Hearst in some quarters by his terrific onslaught the general effect will be overwhelmingly the other way, that thousands and thousands of voters who have been obsessed by the speciousness of the Hearst theories, have had their eyes opened. The immense significance of Root's speech, in its larger relations to the general development of the nation and the national character are temperately summed up in an editorial in the Sun headed, "The Federal Interposition," which is as follows:

WITHOUT A PRECEDENT.

"The speech delivered last night by the secretary of state is without any precedent in the history of the country. An election is about to take place in this state and the people are called upon to choose between two candidates. At the supreme crisis of the campaign the federal executive feels itself imperatively called upon to interpose with all the general forces and influence at its command in favor of one of those candidates and against the other. The whole weight, dignity and authority of the national administration are exerted in an extraordinary appeal. One candidate is approved and commended to all our citizens and the other is denounced in terms which, while temperate in form and judicial and dignified in tone, can be regarded only as destructive when addressed to sane and patriotic men."

"No episode in our history can compare with it. The president of the United States is speaking. He is doing so in no individual or personal capacity, but as the nation's head, clothed with the traditional power of his exalted office. He has chosen the secretary of state, one of the most

CONSUMPTION IN U.S. NAVY AND ARMY

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—Tuberculosis has made alarming inroads upon the personnel of the navy and marine corps in spite of the measures taken by medical officers to check the disease.

The annual report of Rear Admiral Rixey, surgeon general of the navy, which was made public today, shows that, in 1905, the number of tuberculosis cases in the service was 243, or 6.1 for every 1,000 men. In 1895 the ratio was only 3.2 to every 1,000. Practically all the cases are pulmonary tuberculosis.

The deck force, mess attendants and cooks were most affected by the disease and the machinery force came next. More careful examination of recruits is urged by Admiral Rixey, who also suggests that great care must be taken in isolating tuberculosis cases. He suggests that men whose work keep them below decks should be required to take exercises on deck regularly.

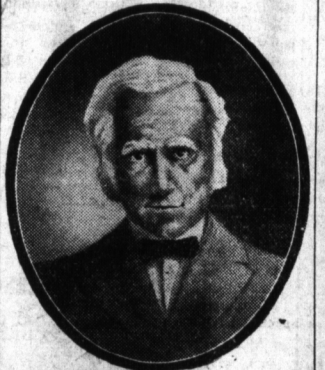
