### PANAMA DISPUTES ZONE JURISDICTION

COLON, May 17 (Special).—Wide-spread interest has been aroused by the case of Senor Don Gonzalez Guill, a criminal Judge of Colon, who is charged in the canal zone with attempting to shoot the captain of a motor launch during an altercation while in canal zone waters. The Panama government has protested against the jurisdiction of the canal zone courts, arguing that the alleged offence occurred in Panama waters.

#### BECKER'S APPEAL

ALBANY, N. Y., May 15.—The appeal in the case of former Police Lieut. Charles Becker, of New York, convicted of the murder of Herman Rosenthal, the gambler, will be argued before the Court of Appeals on June 16. The court to-day granted a motion extending the time for argument to that date. The motion was made by Joseph A. Shay, Becker's attorney, who filed an affidavit with the court stating he wished more time to investigate possible new evidence.

#### LITTLE GIRL SPELLING STAR.

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., May 15.—Opal Mitchell, aged 10, of Licking, Texas County, tonight won a \$100 prize and was declared the best speller in the State. In a contest in which sixty pupils from as many counties contested, she misspelled but three of 200 words.

#### VETERAN OF ENGLISH COMMONS RETIRES.

LONDON, May 16.—Lord Claud Hamilton, who was elected to Parliament before either Disraeli or Gladstone became Prime Minister, and is thus the last link with the House of Commons as it was in the days of Palmerston, Russell and Derby administrations, has decided to retire at the next general election.

### KING ALFONSO NOT TO MEET KAISER

MADRID, May 17 (Special).—The Spanish Premier, Conde Alvaro de Romanones, denies the report that King Alfonso and the German Emperor are to meet during the coming summer.

Such a meeting was considered significant because of a possible Franco-Spanish military alliance, to which the German Emperor is opposed.

#### EVELYN THAW'S ENGAGEMENT IS MUCH CRITICIZED.

LONDON, May 15.—Nobody here credits the vague rumor current here and cabled from Paris to America that Mrs. Evelyn Thaw committed suicide in that city.

On hearing the report the management of the London Hippodrome, where she is under contract to appear May 21, in the revue "Hullo Ragtime," telephoned to Paris in an endeavor to get authentic information about her, but found that she had not been at the hotel where she said she was going.

#### RAILWAYMEN ASK FOR AN INCREASE.

DETROIT, May 15.—"Conductors on 48 Eastern railroads will present their demands for an increase in wages of from 15 to 20 per cent July 1, and if the roads refuse to arbitrate, a strike will be ordered within the night following," said F. S. Thomas, general chairman of the Eastern Association today. He is here attending the biennial convention of the order of railway conductors.

#### FRENCH ANTI-GAMBLING MEASURE DEFEATED.

PARIS, May 15.—The anti-gambling proposal introduced by deputy Jacques Piu, was rejected by the chamber of deputies today by a vote of 331 to 220.

The Piu amendment sought to revoke all gambling licenses granted under the law of 1907. It first came up in the chambers on Friday last, when the chambers adopted a resolution in favor of its further consideration. The acceptance of the amendment would have involved the closing of many clubs and summer resort casinos.

#### FIRES SWEEP TWO FORESTS.

PITTSBURG, Pa., May 15.—A serious forest fire is sweeping Valley Township, Armstrong county, and in less than twenty-four hours has burned over an area of four miles, and nearly a mile wide. Originating in a sawmill, the fire spread quickly, and millions of feet of timber have been destroyed. Two gas wells in the path of the flames are burning.

#### INSTITUTE MEETING.

A meeting of Lots 27-28 Institute was held in Searletown Hall on the 9th inst with President Mr. G. W. Cameron in the chair. The meeting opened at 8 p. m. and the subject of pure bred stock was introduced by the President and discussed by several of the farmers. The opinion was freely expressed that it would be to the advantage of farmers and stockbreeders if all the scrub sires were destroyed. A motion by Mr. Lewis Trueman, seconded by Mr. Leigh Lowther, favoring the plan of allowing a discount on the service fee of registered purebred stock to Institute members. It was moved by Mr. Lewis Trueman seconded by Mr. A. Holland that the institute favor the running of autos on three days of the week. It was moved in amendment by Mr. Hugh McLean and seconded by Mr. Frank Hayes that the institute disapprove of the running of autos on P. E. I.

After a long discussion the amendment was put and carried unanimously. A motion also passed in favor of holding the annual picnic on the Experimental farm, Charlottetown if arrangements can be made with Superintendent Clark.

#### TELEPHONE GIRLS MAY NOW MARRY IN SUNNY ITALY.

ROME, May 15.—Through the kindly influence of Queen Elena and Dowager Queen Margherita, Italy's thousands of telephone girls have been freed of the bondage of spinsterhood, by parliament's decree, has been put back on the wire after holding the receiver for seven celibate years. And those stern statesmen who decreed that "love is extremely detrimental to the state telephone service," have been properly rebuked.

The law of 1906, providing that telephone girls in the Government's service must not marry between the ages of 18 and 25 has been repealed, to take effect Saturday.

#### THIEF GETS 74 DIAMONDS.

NEW YORK, May 15.—Detectives are scouring New York for a diamond thief who has stolen by a pickpocket from the handbag of Mrs. E. L. Jessup, a society leader of Denver, in a West 34th street store. The thief also got \$30 from the bag.
