SERIOUS FIRE.—Shortly after noon on Sunday last fire was discovered in a barn of hay on the premises of Mr. Ernest Penny, of Murray Harbor. The wind being fairly brisk the fire made rapid headway and soon the adjoining barn was in flames. The machine house was also destroyed together with several pieces of farm machinery. About four tons of hay were burnt besides a horse and some wheat and oats. Mr. Penny's loss is a serious one there being only a small amount of insurance on the buildings. At one time it looked as though several other buildings would be destroyed as fire was carried by the high wind to Mr. W. D. Irving's and set his barn on fire, as also was Mr. Stewart's. The neighbors gathered in haste and their timely assistance prevented the fire from reaching the dwelling house close by.

SHIPPING AT HALIFAX.—Four Cape Breton schooners arrived in Halifax Friday for salt and other supplies preparatory to fitting out at their home ports for summer fishing, their yearly vocation, and bringing their season's catch to Halifax. Then they take home their winter food and fuel supplies and if the season is not too late, make a couple of trips to Prince Edward Island for produce. The four vessels arriving were the Eldora, Captain Fred Porrier; Florence B., Captain Alexander Baker; Petite, Captain Alexander Porter, all from Digby, and Rosie M. B., Captain Anselm Sampson, from River Bourgeois. The schooner Flora M. J., Captain Charles Bourdeau, was the first of the River Bourgeois vessels to come here this spring for the same purpose and cleared yesterday. 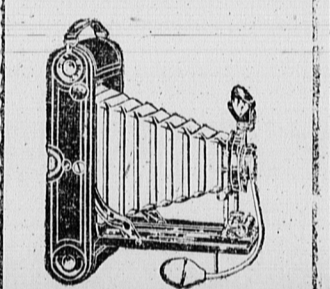

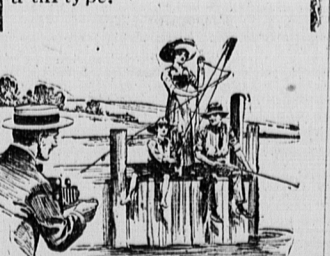

MR. A. J. BAMBRICK HAS SIX SONS IN KHAKI

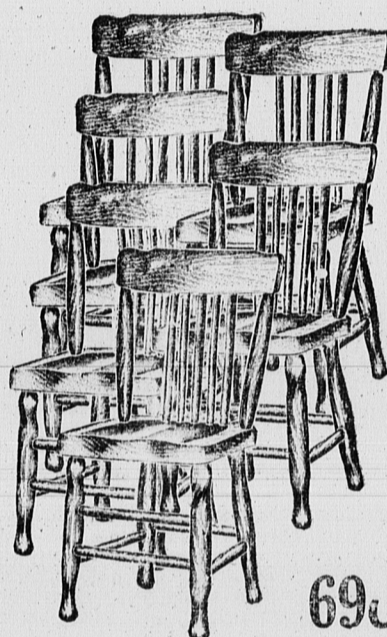
The following letter is from Joseph Bambrick, son of Mr. A. J. Bambrick, Bristol, Lot 4, Joseph the youngest is the sixth of Mr. Bambrick's sons to enlist. Three are in France, one a prisoner in Germany, one in American army 414 Squadron A.S.S.C. and James honorably discharged at Halifax in 1914, being medically unfit for military service.

Somewhere in France, April 5th, 1918.

Dear Mother—Just a few lines to let you know I am well and getting along fine. We are billeted in an old barn, and will be here for perhaps three weeks. We are not cold for we have plenty of straw to sleep in but when we go out we need not look for a door, just walk any direction and we are outside. We have lots of water to wash, a river alongside. The Huns visited us last night and dropped three bombs, but one of our chaps got after him and he had to beat it.

One exploded about fifty yards from where I was. The guns are booming night and day as there is a battle going on and a big one.

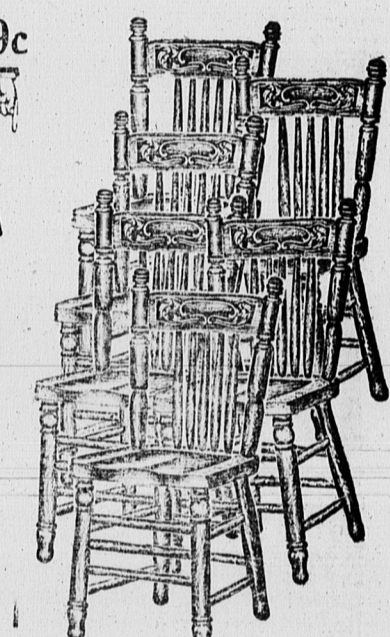
