lem convention, International workers, summer school, finance and Field Secretary. The committee recommended that the same arrangement be made with the Field Secretary as last year.

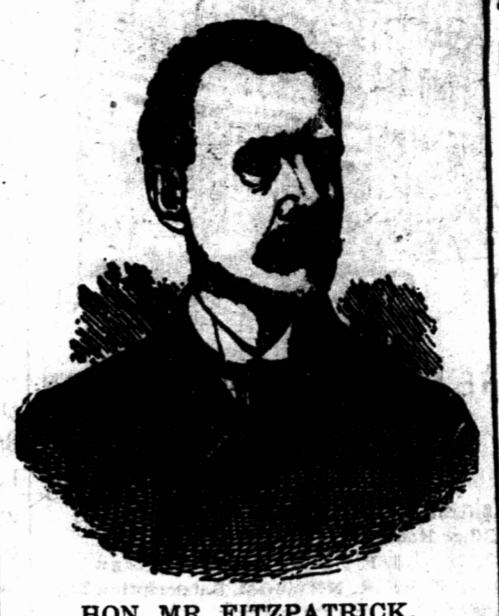
BOUNDARY AWARD IS NOW SIGNED

THE BOUNDARY AWARD SIGNED. LONDON, October 20.—(Special)—The Alaskan Boundary Award was signed today by Lord Alverstone and the three American Commissioners. The signatures of four Commissioners make the award as binding as if all had signed it.
