## Rainbow Takes Lead In Yacht Classic

### Defender Takes Third Straight From Challenger

#### Both Yachts Experience Trouble With Sails—Rainbow Wins By Nearly A Mile.

(By Edward J. Neill) (Associated Press Staff Writer) NEWPORT, R. I., Sept. 24—Sailing before the wind like a huge white gull, beating sturdily back as though she never had known a conqueror, Harold S. Vanderbilt's Rainbow rounced the British challenger Endeavour for the third straight time today and pushed the recent America's Cup farther than ever from the reach of T. O. M. Sopwith's straining fingers.

#### Upsets Dope

The defender, despite the loss of a parachute spinnaker torn in a breeze that at times reached 20 knots out of the northeast, continued to upset all expert calculations by turning in the highest winning margin so far, four minutes and 50 seconds, in weather that was supposed to be made to order for the invader.

In fact it was the second official victory for the American in 24 hours for only last night did the race committee in charge of the show lodged after Rainbow had run his blue-hulled speed home by one minute and 51 seconds Saturday.

#### Spinnaker Tears

Rainbow, with her parachute spinnaker expert, Herman Hoyt of New York, at the wheel in Vanderbilt's place, was a full half-mile ahead, three quarters of an hour after the start when a rip suddenly appeared in the side of the huge canvas balloon ballooning out ahead of her. The tear raced up the side. Then ripped back to the clews, chewing a huge "V" out of the sails.

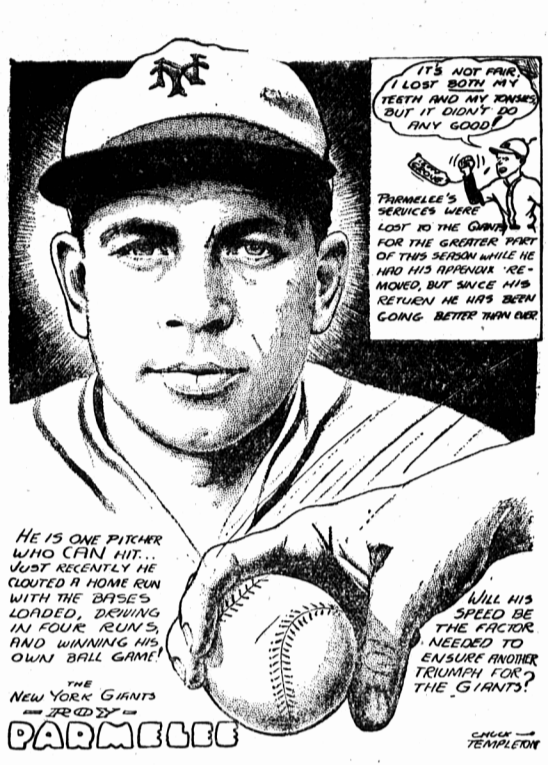

### Vanderbilt Wins Clean Cut Race From Endeavour

#### One More Victory Needed By Rainbow To Retain The Coveted America's Cup.

(By Andrew Merkel, Canadian Press Staff Writer) NEWPORT, R. I., Sept. 24—Harold S. Vanderbilt won a clean-cut victory over T. O. M. Sopwith today to make the score for the series, Rainbow three; Endeavour two. One more victory for the defender will mean retention by the New York Yacht Club of the America's Cup, continuously held on this side of the Atlantic for the past 83 years.

Today's race was perhaps the most uninteresting from a spectators' standpoint of the series to date. Conditions were ideal for the encounter. An offshore wind varying from 10 to 15 knots made for a smooth sea and enabled both yachts to show their best wares.

#### Takes Early Lead

Rainbow seemed to drop Endeavour consistently on the run down the wind to the first mark although actually the challenger was made to sail through at least a mile more water than was necessary for no apparent reason. This extra mile just about represented the lead of four minutes, 49 seconds, established by Rainbow for the first half of the course. Endeavour overtook Rainbow on the last 15 miles of windward work by 39 seconds, but the margin, of course, merely reduced the lead piled up by Rainbow on her worst point of sailing, dead before the wind.

#### Failed to Take Advantage

In the meantime Endeavour had come up and appeared to be on even terms with the defender. But she immediately bore away to westward of the course to the mark, throwing away the momentum.
