WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—(Special)—The international commission has adjourned until January fifth.

KINGSTON, December 16.—Rev. Dr. Evans, who has spent some years as a missionary in Palestine, is having a steam yacht built here, which he will use on the river Jordan. The yacht, which will be called "The Nazarene" will be 80 feet long, seven feet in width, and three feet in depth, and will weigh 3,500 pounds. She will be thoroughly fitted for missionary work in the inland waters of Palestine. The boat will be taken to Halifax by rail thence by steamer to England and from there to Palestine.

Van Wart of Calgary, from his wife, Annie Ma/Tibbits, of Oakland, California, on the grounds of desertion.

## SULTAN AND ARAB

The Kaiser May Not Get His Plot.

**Forty Thousand Bedouins Will know the Reason Why—The Anarchist Conference—King Oscar III—Spanish Commissioners Returned to Madrid.**

ROME, Dec., 19.—(Special)—The Sultan bought for £12,000 from an Arab chief the plot of ground he gave to Emperor William, who in turn, presented it to the German Catholics in Palestine.

It now appears that the Sultan forgot to pay and now the Bedouin chief with 40,000 followers claims the land will not let any foreigners use it!

LONDON, Dec., 19.—(Special). Capt. Borchgrevink's expedition has started for the antarctic regions.

LONDON, Dec., 19.—(Special)—King Oscar of Sweden and Norway, has been taken suddenly ill.

The Rome Correspondent of the Times says:—"I have reason to believe that the International Anarchists conference which has been in session here for several weeks, has proved a success.

"Great secrecy is maintained regarding proceedings and conclusions, but the delegates seem satisfied that they have laid a solid foundation for a uniform system of dealing with anarchists. The conference declines to recognize anarchist outrages as a political crime."

MADRID, Dec. 19.—Senor Montego Trios and other members of the Spanish Peace Commission reached Madrid last evening. They were met by Senor Gamazo, leader of dissenting Liberals, and many other politicians and high officials.

Their arrival was not attended with any special incident. Last evening the Queen Regent received Senor Montero Rios in audience.

This traffic is based upon the report and recommendations made by Hon. Robert Forster, special commissioner of the United States, who was sent to Cuba for the purpose of making an investigation of the department of revenue and customs.

The steamer Manchester Enterprise, the first of the Manchester liners, arrived here today.

NEW CARLISLE, Que., Dec. 19.—The Gaspeia, the pioneer steamship of the Canada Steamship Line arrived here from Milford Haven yesterday after eleven days passage.

She will leave Paspébiac today for Europe and will touch at Charlottetown on the way for the purpose of loading horses, sheep and cattle.
