### CRANBERRIES.

Cranberries were formerly known under the name of marsh or tea whort, fenberries, marshberries, mossberries. In 1672 Josselyn described the cranberry as the bear berry. The word so inseparably associated in the English mind with turkey is not in Johnson's or Bailey's dictionary. Perhaps the colonists adapted it from the German krankebeere or kranbeere, the berry now known preferably by German lexicographers as aftenbeere. Wherever the name came from, it appeared in English literature in 1672. As noted above, and from a writer of 1694 we know that cranberry tarts were then relished, as they were later by Queen Victoria in the high lands.

### CARE OF THE EYES.

Do not study or read by poor light. Light should come from the side and not from the back or from the front. Do not read or study while suffering from bodily fatigue or during recovery from illness. Do not read while lying down. Do not use the eyes too long at a time for near work, but give them occasional periods of rest. Reading and study should be done systematically. During study avoid the stooping position or whatever tends to produce congestion of the head and face. Select well printed books. Avoid bad hygienic conditions and take sufficient exercise in the open air. Let the physical keep pace with the mental culture, for defective sight is most usually observed in those who are lacking physical development.

### PUTTING GLOVES ON.

Remember, if put on badly the first time, a glove will forever after remain out of shape, especially if worn that way.

If you have not time to adjust new gloves in the store, at least do not wait until ready to go out on a pressing engagement before putting them on for the first time. Take your first leisure moment after buying and put on each liner carefully, first shaking a little powder into the gloves. Do not buy small gloves, better a large size.

### ABOUT PEANUTS.

### COMET IN COLLISION.

The theory that a large comet collided with the earth just 880 years ago appears to Prof. W. H. Pickering as quite plausible. Geologists have reached the conclusion that the now famous crater near Coon Butte, Ariz. is the scar left by a great fall of meteoric matter, and the fact that seven of the 10 largest known meteorites have been found within 500 miles of this place suggests that all have been scattered fragments from the same fall. They are similar from three to twenty tons each. Geological evidence at Coon Butte indicates that the collision occurred less than 5000 years ago, and stunted cedars growing in the crater show by their annual rings that the time must have been at least 700 years ago.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may home-stead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending home-steaders.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on an arm of at least 80 acres solely owned, and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$20 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$30 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.

### THE DANGEROUS FLY.

In an evening address at the recent annual meeting of the Ontario Entomological Society, Dr. Hewitt, the new Dominion Entomologist, entertained and instructed a very large audience by an account of the common house fly. He said that these insects were among the most dangerous of all chiefly through the part they played in spreading disease. Numerous cases of typhoid were caused by them, and the death of thousands of infants was shown to have been brought about by their agency. The main way in which the flies carry disease is by first frequenting excrement from sick patients, or filth laden with disease germs, or sores on animals of any kind, and then getting thousands or even millions of the germs on their legs, tongue and body. Then, alighting on the food and drink, they contaminate it with these germs, and thus introduce them into the human system. All mothers and housekeepers should see that food, and especially milk for infants, is kept where flies cannot get access to it. Moreover, no filth of any kind but especially horse-manure, should be left exposed, because it is in these that the flies lay their eggs and breed. A single fly may lay about 1,000 eggs, and these may all turn into full-grown flies in about ten days after they are laid.
