Felix Benoit, one of the crew, went to cast off the sheet, which was fast to the rack-rail in the rigging, and in some unknown way fell overboard. A bundle of shingles was flung overboard, and the captain called to him to seize it but he failed to do so. The ship's boat was also lowered, but by the time it reached the place where Benoit fell he had passed out of sight. Benoit was a good swimmer, but was probably dragged down by the weight of clothing. Besides heavy top boots, he wore two or three coats. The unfortunate man was about 40 years of age, and belonged to Madame Island, near Arichat, where he leaves a wife and six or seven children to mourn his untimely end.—Examiner.

He dines sumptuously who dines out of debt.

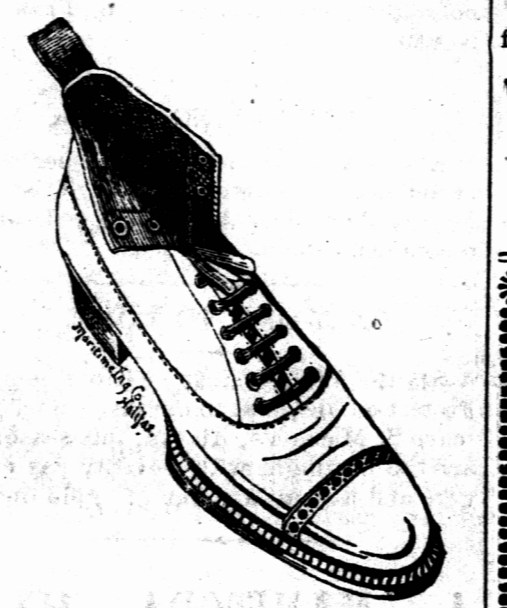
