Annual C. W. L. Convention

At Miscouche

The annual convention of the Catholic Women's League will be held this year in Miscouche on Tuesday Wednesday and Thursday.

A farewell reception was tendered Group Capt. E. A. Blake, M.M., O.B.E., and Mrs. Blake in the City Council Chamber last night.

Group Capt. Blake, leaves soon for England and Wing Commander G. C. Wood has been appointed to command No. 31 Air Navigation School, Group Capt. Blake came here in Dec. 1940 and was promoted to Group Captain in March 1941.

Group Capt. Blake referred to the auxiliary value of many of the Island inhabitants in carrying out rescue work when air craft were in distress, and the co-operation shown with airman training here.

He wished the losses of Prince Edward Island would be light in the present conflict, and hoped to return some day to this Province.

Premier J. Walter Jones, at whose residence, Anne's daughter, the Group Capt. and Mrs. Blake, has been a war guest for some time, told the gathering that she was not entirely willing to leave the place she had grown to like so well.

Premier Jones heartily endorsed the work of Aircraft Detection Corps who work on a 24 hours basis, and advised the full co-operation of the citizens in promoting its furtherment.

Dr. W.J.P. MacMillan, O.B.E., who recalled that the names conferred on the counties, principal City, and the Province of Prince Edward Island itself, were derived from British Royalty and he hoped that the ties between the Province and Britain will never be broken.

He assured the departing couple they would always be welcome here.

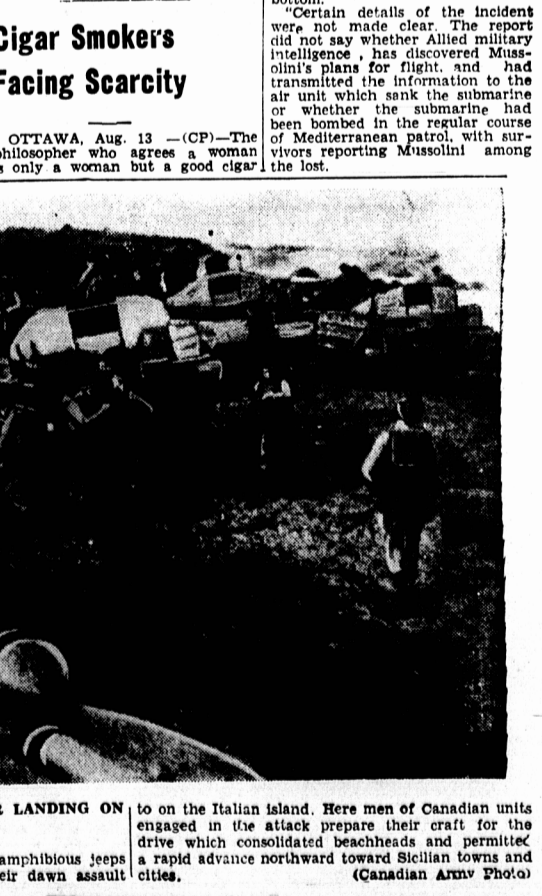
