When ships meet head winds and get caught in mud banks the staunch little tug proceeds to their aid and guides them safely to their respective piers, a great saving of time and labor for those interested.

FOOTBALL RULES.

A good deal of comment has been passed on the action of the P. E. I. Football League in adhering to the old style of Rugby. Rules which improve the game from the standpoint of the player or the spectator are not enforced as they should be. In the revised rules of the Rugby Football Union are no important changes, but there are some rules which are particularly worth calling attention to. The important sections in regard to penalties that need attention are that free kicks shall be awarded if any player: "Does not immediately put the ball down in front of him, on being held." "Being on the ground and does not immediately get up." "The ball having come out, wilfully return it by hand or foot into the scrimmage." "Being in a scrimmage lift a foot from the ground before the ball has been put into such scrimmage." "With these clauses strictly enforced by referees, at the outset, the players would come to understand what is required of them, and the game would be much faster. Another rule for those who are inclined to play rough should also be enforced: "For the first offence the referee shall either caution the player or rule him off and for the second offence he MUST order him off." The success of the game depends as much on competent referees who will enforce the rules, as it does on the players.

A good deal of local interest will be aroused by the placing of a wireless station at the Magdalen Islands. A Halifax exchange says: Mr. Taylor, construction engineer of the Marconi Company, will arrive in Pictou in a day or two on his way to the Magdalen Islands, where he will superintend the erection of a new wireless station. Work on the station will be rushed, says the Pictou Advocate, and it will be opened this winter, giving communication for the Magdalen Islands in case of a break in the cable such as occurred last winter. Three men will be stationed on the Magdalen Islands in the winter months and probably two in the summer months. With wireless stations at the Magdalen Islands and Pictou it is likely that the steamer Lady Sylbil will be equipped with wireless next season. The Point Amour and Belle Isle stations will be kept open all next winter, which will be of benefit to the sailing steamers in the spring.

CANADA WILL LOOK AFTER THEM NOW

OTTAWA, Oct. 14.—The Canada marine department has arranged to take over from the United States the lighthouses, lights and other aids to navigation in the Lime Kil crossing on the Detroit River. Although the crossing is Canadian territory, the aids to navigation at this point have hitherto been looked after by the United States, in view of the fact that some years ago the channel was dredged and improved by U. S. American Government. The minister of marine says the next year his department will effect considerable improvement in the lighting of the channel.

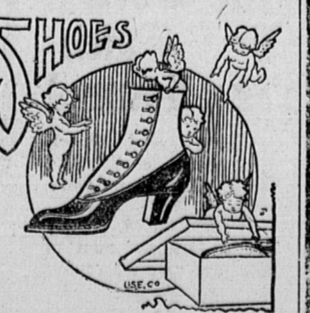
