Britain Pays \$50,000,000 On Account Grand Master Pays Official Visit to Summerside Lodge

(Special to The Guardian.) NEW YORK, Oct. 17.—A check for \$50,000,000 drawn to order of the Treasurer of the United States was deposited today by J. P. Morgan and Company in the Federal Reserve Bank as the first payment on account of interest on British war loan. The British Government has been sending large amounts of gold and United States dollars to the Morgan firm, its fiscal agents for many months in anticipation of this payment. Today J. P. Morgan and Company presented a large number of checks and United States treasury certificates maturing today to a member of the Federal Reserve system and received in exchange the check for \$50,000,000 which was deposited with the Federal Reserve Bank.

Temporary Changes In Federal Offices

OTTAWA, Oct. 14.—Premier King is now acting Minister of Finance. Hon. Jas. Robb, Minister of Trade and Commerce has been acting in this capacity in the absence of Mr. Fielding. Mr. Robb left for Australia last night, however, so the Prime Minister has assumed the duties of the Department of Finance, while Hon. Chas. Stewart has taken over the Trade and Commerce Department. Hon. J.H. King, of Public Works is acting Minister of Labour during the absence of Mr. Marlock and Hon. Jacques Bureau is running the Department of Marine, while Hon. Ernest Lapointe is before the close of the session.

Harrington Receives Correspondents

He took full responsibility for the act, saying he thought the conference was going to be strictly military but subsequent events proved it was also political. He was the first to lift the embargo when he said that the conference was to be opened to everybody.

\$1,500,000 Recovered From Enemy Hands

(Special to The Guardian.) OTTAWA, Oct. 17.—Bringing back to him approximately \$1,500,000 of securities formerly in the ownership of enemy nationals, Thomas Mulvey, K. C., Under-Secretary of State for Canada and Deputy Custodian of Enemy Property, has returned to Ottawa after spending the last few months overseas in connection with the business of the clearing house and the settlement of enemy debts. Some extraordinary claims were encountered but so far only one actual case of forgery in connection with a claim has been met with. Many claims, however, are still under investigation.

One of the important results of Mr. Mulvey's trip, which took him to England, Holland and Germany, was the reaching of a settlement with the public trustees in London as a result of which some \$6,000,000 in securities, will be turned over to Canada. Of this amount some \$700,000 has been delivered. Another result was the setting of a means to direct correspondence between Canada and Austria and Hungary in clearing house matters. Heretofore there was no direct communication with these countries in which, as well as in Germany, there were held many large amounts of Canadian property and shares in Canadian industries such as the C. P. R.

German government officials and others while overseas were pleading "poverty and persecution by the Allies," and there was an apparent desire to delay as far as possible payment of allied claims made against the German government and its nationals. The visit, however, had resulted in straightening out many misunderstandings and bringing a settlement of claims against enemy countries much nearer than it had previously been.

GUNS CONFISCATED BY ALLIES STOLEN

BERLIN, Oct. 17.—Several thousand guns found in haystacks in a Hittite Bavarian village near Ohm, and confiscated by the Inter-Allied Control Commission, were stolen last night before they could be removed by the authorities.

The thieves, still uncaptured, beat the farmers who owned the stacks and removed the rifles, which are generally believed to be the property of secret reactionary organizations.

This is not the first mystery loss of arms confiscated only a few hours before by the Inter-Allied Military Commission, the Socialist Munich Post comments.
