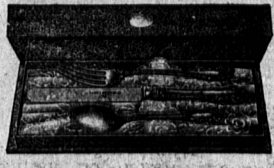

Test for Astigmatism The following is a simple and fairly accurate method of determining whether one's eyes are astigmatic or not.
