Red Wings Hand N. Y. Rangers 10-3 Trimming

DETROIT, Nov. 2 (AP)—Detroit Red Wings poured in 10 goals tonight before a crowd of 7,228 in handing New York Rangers their third straight defeat, 10-3, in the national hockey league.

Rookie Jud McAtee, Detroit left-winger, led the goal-getters with three while Bill Quackenbush and Steve Wochny of the Wings collected two each off goalie Ken McAuley, Detroit's veteran center, Syd Howe, 12, and goalie Ken McAuley.

Detroit scored 07 goals off the Rangers in 10 games last season and had little trouble counting the scoring spree tonight, counting four times after breaking a 2-1 tie at the start of the second period and running up a 7-2 margin before Walt Atanas hit on a solo dash for the Rangers at 4:52 of the final stanza.

Kilby Macdonald and Joe Shack counted New York's other goals in the first period as the Rangers grabbed a 2-1 lead but Quackenbush connected with a short back-hander to tie it up and Moderne (Hue) Bruneteau put Detroit on top to stay at the 21-second mark of the second period.

By losing tonight, the Rangers extended a link under which they haven't won a game on Detroit ice since Christmas night, 1942.

Tonight's triumph was Detroit's second without defeat in league play this season.

Premier King And Election Plans

Shortage Of Merchant Seamen Said Critical

WASHINGTON, Nov. 2 (CP)—A critical shortage of merchant seamen threatens to delay shipment of supplies to the European and Pacific war theatres and the United States shipping and manpower administration, and Paul McNutt, chairman of the war manpower commission, are taking a grim view of the situation.

Mr. McNutt said today that safety of ship operations was threatened by the necessity of sending unlicensed officers and inexperienced deckhands.

During the last summer he had reported that as many as 60 men leaving American ports as licensed deck officers either had no license or sailed above the grade for which they were licensed.
