

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Lesson: Matthew VII., 21-29. March 29.

JESUS THE GREAT TEACHER

Golden Text: Micah VI., 8. "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?"

The lessons of the quarter have been mainly concerned with Jesus as the great Teacher. The Golden Text is most aptly chosen, and certainly describes this mission of teaching. Notice the inclusive note, "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good."

As to the first seven, if we take the thoughts of the Golden Text backwards, we shall follow the order of our lessons. The Divine requirement as to the inner secret of life is that a man shall walk humbly with his God. Our first lesson had as its Golden Text words of Peter, "Likewise, ye yourselves, be subject unto the Lord. You, all of you, gird yourselves with humility, to serve one another: for God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace to the humble."

The first expression of such walk in outward life is that of loving mercy. Our third lesson was that of the good Samaritan, and the Golden Text, "Thou shalt love thy neighbor

as thyself"; while the fourth lesson was that of the story of service actually rendered to the Lord in the days of His flesh, and its Golden Text, "Inasmuch as ye did it unto one of these, My brethren, even these, at least, ye did it unto me."

The Lord also requires that we shall do justly. Our fifth lesson was occupied with the teaching on prayer, and the parable of the unrighteous neighbor, showing how by prayer we are brought into fellowship with the very ways of God, and thus are enabled to do justly; the Golden Text, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you."

The remaining five lessons deal with teaching given more especially to His disciples, and in them certain abiding principles of the life of discipleship are revealed. In the eighth the principle of a true confession of Christ is revealed to be that of the faith which makes fear impossible. In the ninth the principle of the fulfillment of life is revealed as that of having the heart set upon the true treasure which is spiritual rather than upon the false which is material. In the tenth the principle of faithful service is revealed as that of watchfulness for the returning King, expressed in perpetual service in His interest on behalf of His household. In the eleventh the principle of religion is revealed as that of compassion in which the true sanction of the Sabbath is recognized, and fulfilled in such work as makes Sabbath possible to those who are in need. In the twelfth the principle of the Kingdom is revealed to be that of doing the will of God, rather than calling Him Lord.

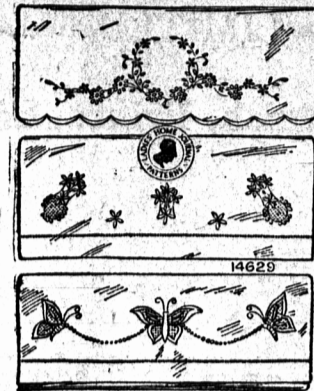

Practical Fashion Hints

Three Designs For Guest Towels.

Dainty little towels of the finest of buckram are now among the necessary linens of every housekeeper. These are for the guest who comes to lunch or dinner or tea after a set of tennis and needs a towel which will be used only once. There are plain and fancy weaves of buckram for making these little towels, and you will find stripes, pretty little all-over figures, as well as the plain qualities at the linen counter. The 15 or 18-inch widths are most practical, for although you can buy the 12 and 14-inch widths these towels are almost too small to be useful. If you expect to finish the ends of the towels with one-inch hemmed hems, cut the material in 28-inch lengths, while if scalloping is to be used on the ends, it may be cut in 27-inch lengths.

The pattern includes designs for stamping three towels and scalloping for finishing both ends of all three. A set of these towels would be an appropriate gift for the bride's linen shower, and if you are planning to make something for the Easter church fair these will surely be salable. Towels such as these can be made to sell for about one dollar and a half each, according to the amount of work.

Initials may be used for marking these towels and you will find either the one-inch script or block style appropriate. The embroidering of the design on the towels should be done in solid work which may be combined with punched work or French dots. Directions and diagrams for the stitches are given on each pattern envelope.

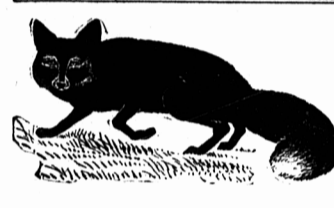
